WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 6 of the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1858, that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant to order and declare that from a certain time therein to be named, two or more districts shall be served by one and the same person as Clerk:

And whereas by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the orders made thereunder and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, the powers of the Lord Lieutenant in this respect became vested in and are now exerciseable by the Governor of Northern Ireland:

And whereas by the Petty Sessions Fees and Administration Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, it is provided that the power of the Governor of Northern Ireland to make an Order declaring that two or more Petty Sessions Districts shall be served by one and the same person as Clerk shall be exerciseable in respect of any districts whether they are all situate in the same county or not, and it is thereby further provided that the appointment of a person to be the Clerk of such two or more districts shall, on the first occasion for such appointment in pursuance of the Order, be made by the Governor of Northern Ireland, who shall select for appointment some one of the persons who filled the office of Petty Sessions Clerk in any of these districts immediately before the coming into force of the Order, or, in the case of the unfitness of all such persons, then some other proper and fit person, and that the salary to be paid to the Clerk so appointed on the first occasion aforesaid for two or more districts shall, notwithstanding anything in Section 6 of the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1858, be such as the Governor of Northern Ireland in his discretion may fix.

Now, I, James Albert Edward, Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the above-mentioned Acts and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby Order and declare that the Petty Sessions Districts of Enniskillen and Letterbreen, both in County Fermanagh, shall from the First day of July, 1924, be served by one and the same person as Clerk:

And I do further appoint Robert Wolsley Robinson, at persent Clerk of Petty Sessions for the District of Enniskillen, to be Clerk of the Districts of Enniskillen and Letterbreen, both in County Fermanagh:

And I do further fix, until further order, the salary of the said Robert Wolsley Robinson as Clerk of both Districts at the annual sum of One hundred and ninety-one pounds. Given at Belfast this 29th day of May, 1924.

STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS, NORTHERN IRELAND,

1924. No. 42.

ROYAL ULSTER CONSTABULARY RE-WARD FUND REGULATIONS, 1924.

The Minister of Finance in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Ministry by subsection (5) of section 4 of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and by section 20 of the Exchequer and Audit Act, 1921, hereby makes and prescribes the following Regulations :-

1. The Regulations governing the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reward Fund (hereinafter referred to as "the Fund"), which bears date the 17th day of October, 1922, shall be cited as the "Royal Ulster Constabulary Reward Fund Regulations, 1922," and are hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations."

2. From the aggregate amount of fees taken by members of the Force acting as Inspectors for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts, 1878-1919, there shall be paid, by way of recoupment-

(i) the amount of Subsistence Expenses incurred by them on the duties of inspection, verification, or prosecution

(ii) the amount of the Temporary Transfer Expenses of the Inspectors acting for more than one Petty Sessions District;

(iii) such expenses incurred in connection with the examination of candidates for the position of Inspector as may be determined by the Ministry of Home Affairs with the consent of the Ministry of Finance to be appropriate to be so paid;

(iv) such amount as the Ministry of Finance may from time to time sanction in respect of expenses incurred by the Ministry of Commerce or by any Department of the Imperial Government acting in their behalf in the execution of their duties under the said Acts;

(v) such other expenses as may be determined by the Ministry of Home Affairs with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, to arise out of and to be incidental to the arise out of inspection of Weights and Measures by members of the Force.

3. The balance of fees, after deduction of the amounts as aforesaid, shall be deemed to be fees applicable to the Fund under paragraph 6 (d) of the Principal Regulations, and shall be accounted for in each Financial Year as follows, that is to say:

(i) there shall be paid from the Fund to each Inspector such annual sum or sums as may be fixed from time to time by the Ministry of Home Affairs with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, but the aggregate amount of such payments in respect of any Financial Year shall not exceed the balance of fees transferred to the Fund in the same period, and varying sums may be paid in respect of varying districts.

(ii) The balance (if any) after the said payments have been made shall be annually merged in the Reward Fund, and be applied to the purposes of the Fund as provided in the Principal Regulations.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the "Royal Ulster Constabulary Reward Fund Regulations, 1924."
