The German Reparation (Recovery) No. 3 Order, 1924, dated July 7th, 1924, made by the Board of Trade under the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921 (11 and 12 Geo. 5. c. 5).

The Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act hereby make the following Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The German Reparation (Recovery) No. 3 Order, 1924."
- 2. Any article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise—
 - (a) that such article is an empty container consigned from Germany to the United Kingdom, solely for the purpose of being filled and returned to Germany,
 - (b) that such article does not pass into the ownership of any person in the United Kingdom, and that no financial or other consideration in respect thereof passes to the consignor,

provided trat security has been given to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners for the return of such article to Germany within a period to be determined by the said Commissioners in each case.

And Whereas it is provided by the Land Trust (Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1923 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1923") that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter called "the Ministry") shall have power to acquire land otherwise than by agreement for transfer to the Trust mentioned in the Act of 1923, and shall for the purpose of such acquisition have all the powers which are conferred upon the said Board by virtue of Section four of the Act of 1919, including power to carry out and complete any scheme made by the said Board before the sixth day of December, 1922, so far as respects the compulsory acquisition of land thereunder, in like manner as if the proceedings taken by the said Board before the said date had been taken by the Ministry in the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Act of 1923:

And Whereas, by virtue of the powers so vested in the Ministry as aforesaid, the Ministry is empowered to make an Order that any site or plot included in a scheme made under Section 4 of the Act of 1919 may be exchanged for another site and plot of equal area, upon the Ministry being satisfied as hereinafter set forth:

And Whereas the Owner of the site and plot described in the 1st and 3rd columns of the Schedule to this Order has petitioned this Ministry to make an Order that the said site and plot may be exchanged for the site and plot described in the 2nd and 3rd columns of the Schedule to this Order:

And Whereas a Map showing the site and plot sought to be abandoned, and the site and plot proposed to be substituted therefor, has been deposited in the Offices of the Ministry, which map is hereinafter referred to as the Deposited Map.

And Whereas the site and plot proposed to be substituted is of equal area with the site and plot sought to be abandoned, and the Ministry is satisfied that the site and plot proposed to be substituted is as suitable as the site and plot sought to be abandoned, and that the proposed substitution is not objected to by the Owner, Lessee, or Occupier of the site and plot proposed to be substituted:

Now, therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers given to it by Section 16 of the Labourers (Ireland) Act, 1886, as applied by Section 4 of the Act of 1919, and by Section I (2) of the Act of 1923, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling it, hereby orders as follows:—

- 1. The site and plot described in the first and third columns of the Schedule to this Order may be exchanged for the site and plot described in the second and third columns of the said last-mentioned Schedule
- 2. The said Scheme shall be completed by the Ministry, so far as respects the compulsory acquisition of the site and plot described in the second and third columns of the Schedule to this Order, in like manner as if the said Scheme had been confirmed by the Ministry, and as if the said site and plot had been included in the Schedule to the said Scheme as confirmed by the said Order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July, 1921.
