It also provides for charging of expenditure in respect of payments in lieu to the Teachers Superannuation Account and makes minor amendments consequent upon the power given to employers under Section 9 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1959, to recover half of a payment in lieu from a repayment of contributions.

- 4. All the rest and residue of her Estate to the Foreign Mission of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland to be applied for the benefit of the
