EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875

WHEREAS Sergeant David Bramwell McCutcheon (No. 6553) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary was, on 25th September, 1958, appointed to be an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the Explosions Act, 1875:

And Whereas the said Sergeant David Bramwell McCutcheon is no longer available for the duties of Inspector:

Now, I, The Right Honourable Brian Faulkner, M.P., being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in virtue of the power conterred on tue by Section 53 of the said Act and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the said Sergeant David Bramwell McCutcheon shall from this day cease to exercise the powers and perform the duties of an Inspector under the said Act.
