Civil Service Commission, 15 Donegall Square West, Belfast, 12th August, 1927.

The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING A LIMITED COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF WRITING ASSISTANT (FEMALE).

1. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered, prior to the 1st November, 1927, and within twelve months of that date, three months' approved service in a Department of the Government of Northern Ireland as a temporary clerk.

2. A candidate will be required to satisfy the Commissioners—

(a) that she is unmarried or a widow;

(b) that she is duly qualified in respect of

nationality, age, health, and character. A candidate must be not less than 18 years of

age on the 1st November, 1927, and must not have attained 40 years of age on or before that date.

No candidate will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father who is also a natural-born British subject.

3. The competition will comprise the following:----

PART I.

Examination in the following subjects, all of which are obligatory:---

PART II.

Interview 200

Of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Part I a number, which will be determined in relation to the number of situations to be filled and taken in order of such aggregate marks, will be admitted to Part II, which will take place at a later date.

4. Subject to compliance with the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2, candidates will be offered vacant appointments in the order in which they are finally placed in regard to their aggregate marks in Parts I and II of the examination. No candidate will be eligible for appointment who does not exhibit a reasonable standard of proficiency.

SYLLABUS.

English.—A candidate will be required to write an essay or letter on a prescribed subject, or to expand a summary supplied to her. She will be expected to keep closely to the subject, to arrange her ideas in orderly fashion, and to write concisely. Effective and exact expression will be rewarded.

She will also be required to summarise the substance of a passage or set of correspondence placed before her, and to answer any questions whether in relation thereto or otherwise which will tend to show her power of understanding and using English. Spelling will be taken into account in all subjects.

Handwriting.—A special test will be imposed, and in addition handwriting will be taken into account in other subjects.

Arithmetic.—First four rules, simple and compound, including imperial and metric weights and measures; simple reduction, vulgar fractions and decimals, excluding recurring decimals; unitary method in proportion; average. (There will be a special test in totting.)

General Knowledge.-The questions set in this subject will be designed to test the candidate as regards-

(a) general intelligence,

(b) general education and information, and

(c) correct and concise expression. The questions will refer mainly to present-day matters, although they will not necessarily be confined thereto. A liberal choice of questions will be given.

The examination will be held in Belfast, in ovember, 1927. The exact place and date November, 1927. and the necessary instructions to intending candidates will be published later.

The Commissioners are authorised by the Ministry of Finance to furnish the following information regarding the appointments:-

The approved scale of salary is 20/-a week, rising by annual increments of 2/-a week to a maximum of 34/- a week, carrying Civil Service bonus at the ordinary rate. The point at which a successful candidate will enter the scale will be determined by the Ministry of Finance.

Increments are awarded annually on a certificate of good conduct and efficiency.

An appointee will be required to serve a probation normally lasting two years, and her appointment will not be confirmed unless such probation affords satisfactory proof of her fitness in all respects (including health) for final appointment. Her services may be dispensed with at any time during the probationary period if the head of the department is satisfied that there is no reasonable prospect that she will qualify for confirmation.

Appointees may be required to serve in any part of Northern Ireland, and are liable to transfer at any time in the interests of the public service.

It is anticipated that the maximum number of vacancies to be filled from the examination will be 15.

TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under powers conferred by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade in Northern Ireland as de-fined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade (Northern Iteland) (Constitution, Proceedings, and Meetings) Regulations, 1924, dated 17th November, 1924, hereby give notice that they propose to fix general minimum time-rates, piece-work basis time-rates and general overtime rates for certain male workers in the said trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed minimum rates will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within one calendar month from the sixth day of August, 1927. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 7 Upper Queen Street, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state, as far as possible, the precise grounds for their objections.
