AGRICULTURAL MARKETING (PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

DETERMINATION OF PIG INDUSTRY COUNCIL FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

The Pig Industry Council for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), in exercise of their powers under Section Five of the Agricultural Marketing

(Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby determine as follows:—

I.—PRICES FOR PIGS.

For the month of January, 1937, pigs sold by a producer shall be sold at the following prices:—

DEAD PIGS.

(A) FOR PIGS SOLD DEAD AND WEIGHING NOT MORE THAN 2 CWT. 0 QRS. 14 LB.

The prices for partly black carcasses will be 5/- below the relevant grade price save that the price for such carcasses under 1c. 0q. 21lb. will be 59/5 per cwt.

GENERAL.

1. There shall be no fixed prices in the following cases:—

(a) Carcasses weighing over 2cwt. 0qr. 14lb.

(b) Wholly black pigs.

Boars.

Rigs or stags.

Sucked sows.

Emaciated or screw pigs.

Pigs visibly diagnosable as diseased before despatch by the producer and subsequently condemned.

Smelling pig carcasses with definite indications of putrefaction.

Pig carcasses badly abused or damaged before being handed over by the producer to the curer.

2. The price for a defective pig carcass weighing not more than 2cwt. 0qr. 14lb. shall be as follows:—

Any pig carcass which has a broken ham or is shoulder-stuck shall be graded and the appropriate grade price shall be payable, but the following deductions may be made from the

value of the carcass:—

(a) Broken ham—Dry, shank and/or shell bone break: 5% of the total value of the carcass.

(b) Broken ham—Wet break: 12½% of the total value of the carcass.

(c) Shoulder-stuck carcass: 3/- per shoulder affected.

3. Where portion of a pig carcass is condemned and the existence of disease could not reasonably have been known to the producer before despatch to the curer, the appropriate grade price shall apply. If the carcass is wholly condemned on account of disease, the existence of which could not reasonably have been known to the producer before despatch to the curer, the relevant Grade 2 or Grade B price shall apply.

The decision as to whether a pig carcass falls within category 1(b), 2 or 3 shall lie solely with the Ministry's grader, who shall give a certificate in writing accordingly.

LIVE PIGS.

(B) FOR PIGS SOLD ALIVE UNDER DIRECT CONTRACT TO WILTSHIRE CURERS:—

(C) FOR PIGS SOLD ALIVE TO THE PIGS MARKETING BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND) AND RESOLD TO WILTSHIRE CURERS:—

In the case of pigs over 1cwt. 2qr. 3lb. dead weight, the prices shall be those applicable to pigs of similar weights, grades and descriptions sold dead, as hereinbefore determined, save that in the case of pigs sold alive under direct contract to Wiltshire

Curers and weighing from 1cwt. 2qr. 4lb. to 1cwt. 2qr. 7lb. dead weight, the prices per dead cwt. shall be: Grade A, 71/5; Grade B, 68/5; Grade C, 65/5; Grades U.L. or U.F., 62/5.

Provided that in the case of pigs sold

alive to the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) and resold to Wiltshire curers the dead weight of such pigs shall, until such time as is otherwise determined, be computed by taking 75 per cent. of the live weight of such pigs when delivered to the said Board.

(D) FOR PIGS SOLD ALIVE TO THE PIGS MARKETING BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND) AND NOT DISPOSED OF TO WILTSHIRE CURERS.

On the basis of a live weight price per cwt. equivalent to the corresponding dead pig price.

Provided that the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) may reduce the price for pigs by a sum not exceeding 5/- per cwt. live weight or such other amount as the Council may from time to time determine.

II.—TERMS OF SALE.

1. In the case of a graded pig carcase the amount to be paid shall be the product (to the nearest penny) of the dead weight of the pig and the relevant Grade or other price per dead cwt. as published in the appropriate ready reckoner issued by the Council, less any prescribed deduction or cut.

2. The curer shall issue to the producer a carcase card in respect of each pig bought and shall issue such carcase card free of charge before the producer slaughters the pig.

3. The producer shall, unless prevented by the Public Health Authorities, deliver the pig in accordance with the terms set out on the said carcase card and in accordance with the arrangements hereinafter set forth, and the curer shall take delivery when the pig is so presented to him by the producer.

4. The producer shall be entitled to deliver dead pigs to the curer at the producer's nearest recognised pork market or other local collecting centre, and the curer shall pay all transport and handling costs subsequent to such delivery. Where a producer delivers dead pigs to a curer's store which is not convenient to the producer's country delivery point, the curer shall pay all the transport charges incurred by the producer, unless it has been the custom for the producer to deliver his dead pigs at the curer's store.

5. Pig carcasses shall be weighed only at such places and by such persons as may be approved by the Council.

6. The producer shall pay for the weighing of dead pigs at markets. The curer shall not charge for weighing done at his store except in the case of a store situated in an area where a special charge is required to be paid under an existing statute, legal right or Charter.

7. The producer may request payment direct by post from the curer and the curer shall comply with such request within four days, or if the producer so requests the

curer shall make payment in cash not later than the date of the market following that in which the sale took place. If payment is made otherwise than by post the producer shall hand the weigh ticket or the curer's delivery receipt to the curer, or his representative, at the time of payment.

8. The curer shall supply to the producer, at the time payment is made, a purchase and grading statement, in a form approved by the Council, showing the name and address of the curer, the name and address of the producer, the date of delivery, the serial number of the carcase card, the dead weight, the weight class and quality grade, the price per dead cwt., the value of each pig, the total value of consignment, authorised deductions, and the nett payment. A copy of this statement shall at the end of the week be sent to the Ministry of Agriculture, or such other person as the Ministry may direct, and a copy shall be retained by the curer.

9. In respect of every pig carcase weighing not less than 1cwt. 0qr. 21lb. and not more than 1cwt. 2qr. 3lb. bought dead by a curer from a producer, there shall be payable by the curer to the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) a sum calculated at the rate of 4/- per cwt. on the weight of the carcase. Sums payable in this respect by curers shall be paid to the Ministry of Agriculture on behalf of the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland), and shall be paid into an account to be utilised by the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) for the payment of an adjustment of 2/- per cwt. dead weight to the price of live pigs sold to Wiltshire curers under paragraphs I (B) and I (C) above, where the dead weights of such pigs are between 1cwt. 0qr. 21lb. and 1cwt. 2qr. 3lb.

III.—SALE BY CONTRACT.

During the month of January, 1937, all pigs sold alive by a producer to a Wiltshire bacon curer otherwise than through the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) shall be sold under contract. Subject to the provisions of Section 9 of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, all such contracts shall be on the terms and in the form approved by the Council. All such contracts shall be void and unenforceable unless and until they shall have been registered with the Council.

CATTLE INDUSTRY (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) ACTS, 1934-1936.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for the Home Department, acting jointly in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the above-mentioned Acts, have made an Order entitled the Cattle Industry (Marking of Imported Cattle) (Amendment) Order, 1936.
