PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Representation of the People Acts, 1918 to 1920, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under those Acts:

And whereas by section 13 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (in this Act referred to as "the Act") the rules contained in the First Schedule to that Act may be altered by Order in Council:

And whereas by section 40 (2) of the Act, any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by those Acts and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The following Rule shall be inserted after Rule 9 of the Representation of the People Order:—

"9A. The following proviso shall be added to the first paragraph of Rule 19 of

the First Schedule to the Act (which provides for a record of addresses of absent voters to be kept by the registration officer):—

"Provided that, in the case of an absent voter serving in His Majesty's Forces, other than an officer in the Army or Air Force, any address furnished by the voter or by the Admiralty, Army Council or Air Force more than thirty days before the nomination of candidates at an election shall not be deemed to be the recorded address of the absent voter."

2. The following shall be substituted for Rule 6 of the Representation of the People Order:—

"Any notification of an address or change of an absent voter received by the registration officer for the purpose of the record of addresses required to be kept under the Act may, if the notification is received too late for a ballot paper to be despatched to the voter at the time of the original issue of the ballot papers to absent voters at an election, be disregarded so far as regards that election, unless it appears to the returning officer that it is reasonably practicable to arrange for a subsequent issue of ballot papers to absent voters and that there is a reasonable probability that a ballot paper sent at such issue to the absent voter at the address furnished in the notification could be returned by the absent voter so as to reach the returning officer before the close of the poll."

3. The following subsection shall be added to

Rule 10 of the Representation of the People Order:—

“(3) In this Part of this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression ‘issue’ includes the original and any subsequent issue.”

4. The following paragraph shall be added to subsection (1) of Rule 15 of the Representation of the People Order (which provides for the issue of ballot papers):—

“Where any subsequent issue of ballot papers is made, the returning officer shall give the election agent of each candidate, as soon as practicable, notice of the time and place at which he will make such subsequent issue and of the number of persons each agent may appoint to attend such issue.”

5. The following proviso shall be added to subsection (1) of Rule 21 of the Representation of the People Order (which provides for the making up and sealing of the absent voters list and counterfoils):—

“Provided that where any subsequent issue of ballot papers is made the sealed packet containing the marked copy of the absent voters list may be opened by the returning officer for the purposes of that issue, and on completion of that issue the list and the counterfoils of the ballot papers at that issue shall be made up and sealed in accordance with this Rule.”

6. Paragraph (a) of Rule 40 of the Representation of the People Order (which prescribes dates with respect to the Second Register in Ireland) shall cease to have effect.

7. Form VIII. of Schedule I. of the Representation of the People Order (being the form of notice as to correction of electors lists by the removal of duplicate entries or placing of marks) shall be amended so that the direction in the margin of that form as to the details to be inserted in paragraph (b) of that form shall read as follows:—

“Here insert the county, district, poor law, or town electoral area as the case may be.”

SCOTTISH BOARD OF HEALTH.

PUBLIC HEALTH, SCOTLAND.

BARNHILL POORHOUSE SMALLPOX DETENTION ORDER, 1920, MADE BY THE SCOTTISH BOARD OF HEALTH UNDER SECTION 79 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1897.

Whereas an outbreak of smallpox has occurred in the poorhouse belonging to the City Parish of Glasgow known as the Barnhill Poorhouse in the City of Glasgow, and the persons, suffering from smallpox have been directly or indirectly in contact with the other inmates and residents in the said poorhouse:

Now therefore the Scottish Board of Health, in virtue of the powers competent to them under Section 79 of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, do hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Barnhill Poorhouse Smallpox Detention Order, 1920, and shall have effect for seventeen days from the date hereof, without prejudice to the power of the Board by Order to continue the operation of this Order for a further period.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, “Board” means the Scottish Board of Health.

“Poorhouse” means the Barnhill Poorhouse, including the administrative and other buildings in connection therewith other than the porter's lodge.

2.—(1) No person who is or becomes during the operation of this Order, an inmate of or resident in the poorhouse shall leave the grounds of the poorhouse without the authority in writing of Archibald Kerr Chalmers, M.D., D.P.H., Medical Officer of Health for the City of Glasgow, whom failing, of Alexander Stuart Murray Macgregor, M.D., M.B., Ch.B., D.P.H., Assistant Medical Officer of Health for the said city.

(2) Any person aggrieved by the refusal of an authority under the preceding paragraph shall be entitled within forty-eight hours of such refusal to appeal to the Board, who shall be entitled to give such authority, and the decision of the Board shall be final.

3. The authority for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Order shall be the Corporation of the City of Glasgow.

ADDITIONAL TREASURY REGULATION UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, RELATING TO PENSIONERS TO WHOM SECTION 1 OF THE ACT APPLIES.

Where in pursuance of an application an increase of pensions is granted, the increase shall continue in force until the expiration of a period of twelve months from the date as from which the increase is payable, unless in the meantime the pensioned dies or ceases to fulfil the statutory conditions.

This Regulation shall be in lieu of No. 6 of the Regulations dated the 30th August 1920, which is hereby repealed.

CENSUS ACT, 1920.

INTIMATION is hereby given to all concerned, that the District Committee of the Fourth or Lochaber District of the County Council of Inverness-shire, acting as Local Authority within said District, has, in terms of the Requisition made in writing by not fewer than Ten Ratepayers, within the District, passed a Resolution, of date 16th April 1920, to form into a Special Drainage District in terms of Section 122 of The Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1897, that part of the said District in the Parish of Glenelg, comprised within the following boundaries, viz. :— All and Whole that area or piece of ground at Mallaig, in the Parish of Glenelg and County of Inverness, extending to fifteen and three-quarter acres or thereby, and bounded as follows :—Starting from a point on the south face of Railway Pier in line with the eastern face of said Fish Platform, thence following round the line of face of said Fish Platform until abreast the line at head of old stone pier, thence in a southern direction along said head of old stone pier, and continuing in a similar direction along the rocks at high water mark till abreast the south corner of the Bay, thence in a south-western direction along an undefined line on the ground, up the beach and across the path leading to the east from Mallaig Pier, and continuing in said direction up the rough pasture ground on Croft No. 14 and to the east of the Public School Feu, a distance of two hundred and seventy-five lineal yards or thereby, thence in a western direction along an undefined line on the ground to the west side of the Public Road leading from Morar to Mallaig a distance of one hundred and eight lineal yards or thereby, thence in a southerly direction along the west side of the said Public Road a distance of sixty yards or thereby, thence in a south-westerly direction along an undefined line on the ground a distance of one hundred and sixteen yards or thereby, thence in a north-westerly direction along an undefined line on the ground to a point in Railway Fence a distance of one hundred and twenty-two yards or thereby, thence in a north-westerly direction along Railway Fence to a point at Iron Strainer a distance of sixty-five yards or thereby, thence in a north by north-westerly by north by north-east by easterly direction, and following along the line of said fence to a point in same at the junction with the Railway Fence, which latter fence separates the Railway ground proper from feus situated to the south-east of same, a distance of two hundred and five yards or thereby, thence in a north-eastern direction along the line of said Railway Fence up to and including the Gate and Road at entrance to Station and Pier, to a point in the wall on the north-east side of said Road and Gate, thence in a northern direction along the western face of said wall, Refreshment Room Buildings, et cetera, to the southern line of Railway Pier, thence in a north-eastern direction along the south face of said pier to a point from which this description commenced, all as delineated on a Plan which can be seen at the Office of the District Sanitary Inspector, Caberfeidh Cottages, Fassifern Road, Fort William.
