TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 24th September 1948, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 27th September 1948 to Saturday the 2nd October 1948 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied

for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PERTH AND KINROSS COUNTY COUNCIL.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930 : SECTION 46.

ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933 : SECTION 29.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on the sixth day of September 1948, the Minister of Transport modified and confirmed the County of Perth and Kinross (Roads Restriction) Order, 1948, made by the Perth and Kinross County Council under Section 46 (1) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 (4) of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, which Order will come into operation on 1st October 1948.

The operative part of the Order as modified is as follows :—

1. The County of Perth and Kinross Roads (Restriction) Order, 1932, and the County of Perth and Kinross Roads (Restriction) Order, 1933, are hereby revoked.

2. Save as hereinafter provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall drive or cause to be driven any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor, or any heavy motor car the unladen weight of which exceeds three and a half tons, on either length of road specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

Provided that nothing in this Article contained shall prevent the driving on either length of road specified in the First Schedule to this Order of any heavy motor car which is constructed or adapted to carry passengers and which has seats for not more than twenty-nine persons exclusive of the driver.

3. Save as hereinafter provide in this Article or in Article 4 of this Order, no persons shall drive or cause to be driven any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor, or heavy motor car, or any motor car with seats for more than 14 persons, exclusive of the driver, on any length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Provided that nothing in this Article contained shall prevent the driving :—

(a) On the length of road specified secondly in the Second Schedule to this Order of any vehicle licensed as a Public Service Vehicle and operating under a road service licence issued under Part IV. of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, which has seats for not more than 20 persons, exclusive of the driver; or

(b) On so much of the length of road specified fourthly in the Second Schedule to this Order as extends from the Hotel at Aberfoyle to its junction with the unclassified road leading to the School and Mill of Chon at the western end of Loch Ard of any vehicle with seats for not more than 29 persons, exclusive of the driver.
