The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 1) Order, 1958, which reduces from 8s. 9d. to 6s. 6d. per cwt. the rate of drawback allowable in respect of Customs duty paid on solid insoluble quebracho extract used in the manufacture of certain exported soluble quebracho extracts or blends of soluble quebracho extract with myrobalan extract.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF POSTAL AND TELEGRAPH OFFICERS IN THE POST OFFICE.**

- Both men and women are eligible.
- Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on a governing date defined below, except that for competitions for appointments in the London Postal Region (Inner and Outer Areas) and in the Head Post Office areas of Basildon, Berkhamsted, Birmingham, Brentwood, Cambridge, Chelmsford, Chesham and Amersham, Dorking, Harlow, High Wycombe, Luton, Maidenhead, Maidstone, Slough, Tonbridge, Ware, and Windsor, candidates must be at least 16 and under 25 years of age on the governing date.

The governing date is defined as follows:—

For competitions held in January to April in each year, the date is the 1st May immediately following.

For competitions held in May to August in each year, the date is the 1st September immediately following.

For competitions held in September to December in each year, the date is the 1st January immediately following.

**3. Nationality.**

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish

Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

**4. Examination.**

The examination consists of seven short tests as follows:—

- Spelling lasting 10 minutes and carrying 15 marks.
- Arithmetic lasting 25 minutes and carrying 60 marks.
- Comprehension lasting 20 minutes and carrying 30 marks.
- General Knowledge lasting 30 minutes and carrying 50 marks.
- Problems lasting 20 minutes and carrying 40 marks.
- Expression lasting 15 minutes and carrying 15 marks.
- Essay lasting 30 minutes and carrying 40 marks.

Separate competitions will be held for the various Head Post Office areas, and for the London Postal area, and candidates for each area will be arranged in order of merit on their total marks in the examination as a whole. No candidate may compete for a vacancy in more than one area at the same time. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain a total which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

**5. Offer of Appointment to Unsuccessful Qualified Candidates.**

(a) A candidate who reaches the pass mark in a competition but is unsuccessful in obtaining an immediate vacancy in the area in which he competed may, if circumstances warrant, be offered appointment—

(i) to a vacancy arising in that area after the date of the competition which he attended, or

(ii) to a vacancy in another area in the same Region

which it has not been possible to fill by a local competition, or

(iii) to a vacancy in the London Postal Region.

No such offer will, however, be made more than six months after the date of the competition which the candidate attended.

(b) A candidate aged 18 or over on the governing date for age for the competition he attended may only be considered under this Regulation for vacancies in the areas specified in Regulation 2.

(c) Offers of appointment under the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) above will be made according to the candidates' order of merit in the Region in which they competed. Acceptance of appointment under the provisions of (a) (ii) or (a) (iii) will not preclude any subsequent offer of appointment under (a) (i).

**6. Health and Character.**

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on their health and character. They must be at least 5 feet in height (without shoes).

**7. Candidates Trained as Teachers.**

Candidates who have been trained as teachers in Northern Ireland and in the Irish Republic, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Commissioners.

**8. Refund of Marriage Gratuity.**

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

**9. Fee.**

No fee is required.

10. The Commissioners' decision will be final in all matters concerning these competitions.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT DURING 1958 TO THE CLERICAL CLASS, THROUGH THE GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION, OF MEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE SERVED, OR ARE SERVING, IN H.M. FORCES.**

1. Both men and women are eligible.

2. Candidates may not compete more than once under these Regulations during 1958.

3. *Age.*

No age limits are prescribed.

4. *Nationality.*

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic; or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment;

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment;

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

5. *Service.*

(i) Candidates must by the date on which they submit their application forms have completed a period of whole-time service in H.M. Forces, provided that a candidate who is still serving but whose whole-time service will cease not later than 31st December, 1958, may apply to be interviewed.

(ii) No candidate will be eligible whose whole-time service in H.M. Forces ceased before 1st January, 1957.

6. *Education.*

(i) Candidates (except those taking Scottish or Northern Ireland examinations) must have obtained, in not more than two examinations for the General Certificate of Education, passes at either Ordinary or Advanced level in English Language and in four other distinct subjects.

(ii) Candidates taking Scottish examinations must have obtained, in not more than two examinations for the Scottish Leaving Certificate or Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination, passes on either the lower or the higher grade in English and four other distinct subjects.

(iii) Candidates educated in Northern Ireland may offer appropriate passes obtained in not more than two examinations for the Grammar School Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland.

(iv) The subjects that will be accepted are those included under the following headings: English, General Paper, classical and modern languages, history, politics, economics, geography, religious knowledge, mathematics, science, engineering, navigation, and surveying; the same subject may not be counted at both Ordinary and Advanced level.

7. *Interview.*

The Commissioners will invite to interview all candidates who appear to be eligible. The Interview Board will recommend to the Civil Service Commissioners those candidates considered suitable for appointment.

8. *Health and Character.*

Candidates selected for appointment must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on their health and character before they can be appointed.

9. *Candidates Trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers in Northern Ireland or in the Irish Republic, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Commissioners.

10. *Refund of Marriage Gratuity.*

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

11. *Conversing.*

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

12. *Fee.*

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

A successful candidate who has attended a written examination for appointment to the Clerical Class of the Home Civil Service held during 1958, and has paid the fee for that examination, will not be required to pay a further fee. A successful candidate who has applied to sit a written examination for appointment to the Clerical Class of the Home Civil Service to be held during 1958, and has paid only the application fee of 7s. 6d. for that examination, will be required to pay a fee of 12s. 6d., being the balance of the fee of £1.

13. *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will decide, after consideration of any recommendations made by the Interview Board, to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

14. The Commissioners' decision will be final in all matters concerning this competition.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held during 1958 under the above Regulations.
