TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946 SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949 CONONBRIDGE AND MARYBURGH BY-PASS

FACTORIES ACTS, 1937 to 1959

ON 4th July 1961, the Minister of Labour made The Lead Paint (Prescribed Leaflet) Order, 1961. The Order, which comes into operation on 17th July 1961, prescribes the form of leaflet which employers of persons engaged in the painting of buildings are required by Regulation 7(a) of the Lead

Paint Regulations, 1927 to issue to each such person on appointment and subsequently on the first pay day in each calendar year. The leaflet contains special health instructions to painters on the use of paints and describes the symptoms of lead poisoning and the precautions to be taken to prevent it.
