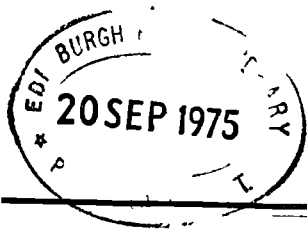

APPOINTING FRIDAY, 26TH DECEMBER 1975 A BANK HOLIDAY IN SCOTLAND AND NEW YEAR'S DAY 1976 A BANK HOLIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES AND NORTHERN IRELAND.

Whereas We consider it desirable that Friday, the twenty-sixth day of December in the year 1975 should be a bank holiday in Scotland and that New Year's Day in the year 1976 should be a bank holiday in England and Wales and Northern Ireland:

We, therefore, in pursuance of section 1(3) of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971, do hereby appoint Friday, the twenty-sixth day of December in the year 1975 to be a bank holiday in Scotland, and New Year's Day in the year 1976 to be a bank holiday in England and Wales and Northern Ireland.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this seventeenth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and in the twenty-fourth year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGNS FOR, AND GIVING CURRENCY TO,
GOLD COINS IN GIBRALTAR

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas, by virtue of a Proclamation issued under the Coinage Act 1870, certain parts of that Act are in force in Gibraltar:

We, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. This Proclamation shall be published in the Official Gazette of Gibraltar and shall come into force there on the date of such publication.
2. Section 3 of the Coinage Act 1870 shall be modified in its application to Gibraltar by the deletion from the second sentence of the word "gold".
- 3.—(1) New gold coins of denominations of one hundred pounds, fifty pounds and twenty-five pounds shall be made.
 - (2) The coins shall be of the standard diameter, standard weight and standard composition specified in the Schedule hereto.
 - (3) In the making of the coins a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard diameter, weight or composition specified as aforesaid) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the amount specified in the Schedule hereto.
4. The designs for the said coins shall be as follows:—
 - (a) For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "Elizabeth II" and "Gibraltar" and the date of the year.
 - (b) The reverse impressions shall be as follows:—
 - (i) one hundred pounds: the Gibraltar coat of arms, with a laurel wreath below and the inscription "100" between, and beneath all the inscription "POUNDS";
 - (ii) fifty pounds: the statue of "Our Lady of Europa", with the inscription "FIFTY POUNDS" below;
 - (iii) twenty-five pounds: a lion sejant with a key in its right paw, with the inscription "25 POUNDS" below.
 - (c) The coins shall have a graining upon the edge.
5. The said coins shall be current and be legal tender within Gibraltar.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 19th September 1975, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Scheme as confirmed shall become operative in accordance with paragraph 16 of Schedule 1 to the said Act on the date on which this notice is first published.

THE POST OFFICE TELEPHONE AMENDMENT (No. 2) SCHEME 1975

Made 29th August 1975

Coming into operation 1st October 1975

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, Citation and Extent

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st October 1975 and may be cited as the Post Office Telephone Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1975.

(2) This Scheme shall apply and extend to the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man.

Interpretation

2.—(1) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme T7/1974) (hereinafter called "the principal Scheme"), as amended by the Post Office Telephone Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme T1/1975).

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of the Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

The amending Scheme, which comes into operation on 29th September 1975, revises postal charges generally and substitutes for imperial units of measurement their approximate metric equivalents.

(This note is not part of the Scheme)

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 10) SCHEME 1975

Made 28th August 1975
Coming into operation 29th September 1975

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 29th day of September 1975, and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1975.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P8/1971) (hereinafter called “The Scheme”) as amended by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P3/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P5/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P9/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P3/1973), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P7/1973), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 6A) Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme P3A/1974), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme P7/1974), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme P8/1974) and the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P3/1975).
- (3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of the Scheme, as subsequently amended, in the definition of "customs duty", the words "purchase tax" shall be deleted and the words "value added tax" inserted in their place.

Prohibitions

£1.00 for each of the first 5 parcels and then 60p for each additional parcel.
- (iii) Where there are more than 30 parcels:
for the first 30 parcels the fee for each as in (ii) and then 35p for each additional parcel."
