LICENSING ARRANGEMENTS

IN a written reply to a Question by Mr. John Townend, M.P. in the House of Commons on 13th July 1981, the Government indicated its intention to introduce controls on the deposit and import of European lobsters (Homarus gammarus) and American lobsters (Homorus americanus). The Secretary of State for Scotland hereby proposes to make the following General Licence to authorise the deposit of any live, dead or processed lobster of the species Homarus gammarus and any processed lobster of the species Homarus americanus in any area designated in Part II of the Schedule to the Lobsters (Control of Deposit) Order 1981. Deposits in designated areas of any live or dead lobster of the species Homarus americanus require an Individual Licence for which application should be made to the Department of Agricluture and Fisheries for Scotland, at the address given below in the notes to the licences, or the local Fishery Office.

The General Licences will be effective from 3rd August 1981.

- This licence is not a dispensation from any regulation other than the Lobsters (Control of Deposit) Order 1981*.
- This licence is valid from 3rd August 1981 until further notice but may be revoked, varied or suspended any time by the Secretary of State.
