TRUNK ROAD (A1)

PENCRAIG HILL IMPROVEMENT

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary of State proposes to make the following 2 orders under sections 5(2) and 12(1) respectively of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984:—

1. The Edinburgh-Berwick Upon Tweed Trunk Road (A1) (Pencraig Hill Improvement) Order 1988, to provide for (a) the construction of a new length of trunk road at Pencraig Hill in the District of East Lothian in Lothian Region to form part of the existing Edinburgh-Berwick Upon Tweed Trunk Road (A1) and (b) the detrunking of the superseded section of trunk road;
2. The Edinburgh-Berwick Upon Tweed Trunk Road (A1) (Pencraig Hill Improvement Side Roads) Order 1988 to provide for the construction of a new length of side road; the improvement of certain lengths of existing road; the stopping up of certain lengths of road when the new trunk road is open for the purposes of through traffic; and the stopping up of a private means of access on the proposed route of the Pencraig Hill Improvement for which a suitable alternative private means of access already exists.

These orders arise from the proposal to provide crawler lanes on both sides of Pencraig Hill.

THE PERTH-ABERDEEN-INVERNESS TRUNK ROAD (A94)
(NORTHWATER BRIDGE TO OATYHILL IMPROVEMENT
SIDE ROADS) ORDER 1988
