Cologne, March 1. The French have demanded of this City a great Number of Palifadoes, to be employed in the Fortification of Deutz; but the Burger-Mafters having made fome Difficulty of complying with the Demand, as we have no Territory out of the Walls, the French Commandant has let them underftand, he will cut down all the Trees on the Ramparts, if they do not comply; and our Garrifon has been augmented by the Arrival of the Regiment of Condé. The French Engineers have Orders to fortify Deutz, and a Battalion of Orleans are fent to garrifon that Place. M. Dauvet, who was placed here, as Commandant, by Marfhal Broglio, is fet out this Morning for Paris; and M Thiange commands here in his Place till the Month of May, when another will be named. The Management of the Forage, Hofpitals, and Provisions of the Army, that were under the Dircction of Perfons named by the General in Chief, are to be given this Campaign to Undertakers, if proper ones can be found.
