His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice, the Persons concerned in Writing and Sending the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the same) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convided thereof.
