And also, as a farther Encouragement, the Church-Wardens of the Parish of St. Stephen Coleman-street, do hereby promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds, over and above the Reward above mentioned, to be paid upon Conviction of one or more of the Offenders, except the identical Person who wrote the Said Letter.
