St. James's, January 18.

THIS Day being kept as the Anniversary of Her Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock. There will be a Ball at Court this Evening, and Illuminations and other Public Demonstrations of Joy in London and Westminster.

St. James's, January 15.

This Day His Majesty was pleased to fill up two vacant Stalls of the most Honourable Military Order of the Bath.

The Sovereign having put on the Ribbon, with the Symbol of the Order hanging to it, Mr. Hill the Gentleman Usher bearing the Scarlet Rod, and habited in the Mantle of the Order, introduced Sir Charles Hotham, Bart. Mr. Whitehead, Register and Secretary of the Order, (in the Absence of Mr. Cullum, Bath King of Arms) carrying the Ribbons on a Cushion, a Gentleman-Usher Daily Waiter carrying the Sword of State, which was delivered to the Sovereign by Sir Jeffery Amherst, a Knight of the Order, Sir Charles Hotham, kneeling, was knighted with the Sword of State. Then Sir James Gray, Bart. a Knight of the Order, having received the Ribbon, with the Badge of the Order, from Mr. Whitehead, presented the same to the Sovereign, who put the Ribbon over the new-made Knight's Right Shoulder; then he had the Honour of kissing His Majesty's Hand; which done, he rose up and retired,

Afterwards Mr. Hill introduced the Honourable William Hamilton in the same Manner; the Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by Sir Jeffery Amherst, as was also the Ribbon by Sir James Gray; and the like Ceremony observed as before.

Many Knights of the Order, the Dean, and the Genealogist attended the Ceremonies, which were performed after the Levée in His Majesty's Closet, several Great Officers of the Court being present.

Pisa, December 27. His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester went from hence on Monday last to Leghorn, and the Day following embarked on Board His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Alarm, in order to proceed to Naples. On his Royal Highness's passing the Fortrefs, he was saluted by Fifty-One Guns; a Dutch Man of War, being then in the Road, saluted his Royal Highness with Twenty-One Guns; and the same Number of Guns were fired from the Alarm, on his Royal Highness's going on Board. During the whole Time of his Royal Highness's Residence here, the Great Duke and Dutchess shewed him the most assiduous Attention.
