AT the Court at St. James's, the 6th Day of November, 1772,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honourable Sir Jeffery Amherst, Knight of the Bath, Lieutenant-General of the Ordnance, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Seymour Conway, General of His Majesty's Forces, to be Governor of the Island of Jersey, he this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken by the Governor of that Island.

Stockholm, October 20. His Swedish Majesty has been pleased to appoint Senator Count Horn to the Post of Grand Master of the Horse, or as it was anciently called, the Kingdom's Master of the Horse: This Post as well as that of Grand Marshal of the Kingdom, which is given to Count Lieven, has been revived by the present King, after being vacant for many Years.

Whitehall, November 6.

A Letter received Yesterday from the Island of Dominica, of the 18th of September, makes Mention of a violent Hurricane in the Latitude of that Island, on the 31st of August last: That Dominica, however, and other Islands to Windward, had escaped the Fury of the Tempest, and had not suffered any considerable Loss; but that they had Intelligence, that the Leeward Islands had very severely felt the Effects of it.

The Letter from Dominica does not mention any Particulars of the Damage sustained in the Leeward Islands, nor have any Letters been as yet received from those Islands.

Whitehall, November 6.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Honourable Edward Hay, Captain-General and Governor in Chief of His Majesty's Island of Barbados, in America, in the room of William Spry, Esq; deceased.

The King has also been pleased to appoint Daniel Horsmanden, Esq; Chief Justice of His Majesty's Province of New York, in America.

Dublin, October 27.

Sunday last being the Anniversary of His Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower. And Yesterday at Noon his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction; and the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
