E have Accounts of the Arrival of Count Corofa at Palermo, with two Battalions confishing of about Seven Hundred Men; and that he has been well received and lodged in the City, but that the Maestranza are not inclined to give Admittance to the Troops, so that they are quartered in the Subarbs. It is said that the Burghers, unless compelled by Force, will not give up their ancient Privilege of guarding the City of Palermo, nor suffer the Duke Fogliani's Return thither: They continue to call loudly for Ratisfication of the Indulto granted them by the Archbishop; and as they are said to amount to twenty thousand armed men, it may require Time to reduce them to Obedience.

Vienna, January 15. We have had To-day, about half an Hour after One o'Clock in the Afternoon, two very smart Shocks of an Earthquake, which were felt in almost every House in Vienna, but without causing any Damage, as we have yet heard. The Weather was calm and pleasant; and a gentle Thaw, with Sunshine.
