by noing Your Family and you in particular dont
let him go thare for so shure as he goe thare so shure
hill be burnt for we are Determind he shall not live
here Abotes and we are Determind to destroy them
borth. but as I no you, dont let him be out on
Thursday Night at any rate. I am sorry I cant let
You no more as my Life and all my Families at
stake if I do so no more at presant my Doome
[Figure of a Gibbet.]

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing
to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in writing
or sending the said Threatening Letter, is hereby pleased
to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them,
(except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter)
who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices
therein; so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended
and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, His Majesty is
hereby pleased to promise a Reward of FIFTY
POUNDS to any Person (except as before excepted)
who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid; to be paid
by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of
His Majesty's Treasury; upon the Conviction of one or
more of the Offenders.
