His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in writing or sending the said Threaten ng Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that be, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, His Majesty is bereby pleased to promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Person (except as before excepted) who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid; to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of one or

more of the Offenders.
