Petersburg, May 7. This Morning at Nine o'Clock the Five First Classes of the Nobility, and the Foreign Ministers, assembled at the Convent of St. Alexander Newsky, the Body of her late Imperial Highness having been previously removed into the Church from the Mourning Hall where it had lain in State. The Empress, attended by several Ladies, arrived there about Eleven, when the Body was deposited with great Solemnity in the Vault of the Church. A short but pathetick Discourse on the Occasion was pronounced by the Archbishop of Petersburg.

Dresden, May 19. The 9th of next Month is the Day fixed for their Serene Highnesses the Elector and Electress of Saxony setting out for the Baths of Lausettadt; from whence the Elector proposes to go to Torgan, Fribourg, &c. to visit the different Camps.

Berlin, May 21. His Prussian Majesty arrived at Charlottenburg on Sunday Evening, and came early yesterday Morning to this Place. His Majesty had the same Day a numerous Levee, at which the Nobility and Foreign Ministers were present. This Morning was the first of the three great annual Reviews; when these are finished his Prussian Majesty will go, as usual, to Magdebourg.
