The Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by Sir Eyre Coote, the Second Knight in Seniority; and Major-General Clinton, kneeling, was knighted therewith: Then Sir Charles Frederick, the Senior Knight, presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign; His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder; who being thus invested, and having kissed His Majesty's Hand, the Procession returned to the Privy Chamber in the above Order, Sir Fenry Clinton, the new Knight,

preceding the Knight Elect.
