SIR, ESTERDAY, at Day-light, the Squadron of His Majery's Ships under my Command descried Twenty-two Sail in the North East Quarter; we immediately gave Chace, and in a few Hours the Whole were taken.

They prove to be a Spanish Convey which failed from St. Sebalitan's the ril of January, and were under the Protection of Seven Ships and Vessels of War belonging to the Royal Company of Carracters.

ETTERS received this Day from Mr. Fitz-ETTERS received this Day from Mr. Fitz-therbert, His Majesty's Resident at Brussels, bring a Confirmation of the Signal Success of His Majesty's Fleet under the Command of Admiral Sir George Rodney, on the 16th of last Month, near the Straits Mouth.

The Spanish Squadron, commanded by Don Juan de Langara, made a Running Fight, the Circumstances of which are not yet particularly known. That Squadron consisted of Eleven Sail of the Line, Three of which, the St. Genaro, St. Justo, and Monarca, separated before the Engage-
