St. James's, September 11. HIS Morning a Mellenger arrived at the Office of the Earl of Hillborough, One of His Majetty's Principal Secretaries of State, with a Letter to his Lordhip from Sir Horace Mann, Bart. and K. B. His Majefty's Finvoy Extraordinary at Florence, inclosing a Letter from Lieutenant-General Murray, Governor of Minorca, dated St. Philip's Castle, August 19, in which the Governor gives an Account, that a Division of the Spanish Fleet and Transports was puthing that Morning to the East Part of the Har-bour of Mahon, with an Intention, as was suppoled, to land Troops in that Quarter; and that another Division appeared to be going to the West Part of the Harbour. The Governor adds, that he had been for fome Time apprized of the Intention of the Enemy, was perfectly prepared to receive them; that the Garrifon was in high Health and Spirits, and that he had no Doubt of making a vigorous Refistance:

## St. James's, September 8, 1781.

WHEreas it has been bumbly represented to the King, That on Friday the 25th Day of Au 19, 1780, about One of the Clock in the Morning, Five Perfone unknown, armed with Clubs and other offenfine Weapons, cure to the House of J. bn Burfey, late a Riding Officer of the Customs at Milton in the County of Officer of the Customs at Button in the County of Southaniston, and, under Pretence of giving the faid Burfey an Information, which he might make a Scizure of fome uncustomed Coods, prevailed on him to get up (the faid Burfey being then in Bed) and to come down and open his Door; that they thereupon im-mediately ruffied in upon him, and with the faid Clubs and other Weapons beat and treated him fourmercifully, by giving him several dangerous Wounds on the Head and other Parts of his Body, that he languished till the 27th, and then died ; and the Coroner's Inquest having fet on the Body, have brought in their Verdict Wilful Murder against the faid Five Perfons unknown :

His Majefly, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the faid Murder, is bereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the Offenders, who shall discover his or their Accomplices, (excepting the Person who astu-ally killed the Officer) fo that they may be apprehended and tonvisted thereof.

## STORMONT.

And the Commiffioners of His Majefly's Cuftoms, in order to bring the Offenders to Juffice, do hereby pro-mifs a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to the Perfon or Perfons who shall discover and apprelend, or cause to be difcovered and apprehended, any one or more of his or their Accomplices, (excepting the Perfon who actually killed the faid Officer as aforefaid) to be paid by the Receiver-General and Cashier of the Customs upon Conviction.
