The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

T is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, That an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Vessels laden, or to be laden, in any of the Ports of the Islands of Jersey, Guernfey, Alderney, and Sark, with Beef, Pork, or any Sort of Salted Provisions; and that the faid Embargo do continue and remain upon such Ships and Vessels until farther Order.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of H's Majefty's Treafury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said respective Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, and Sark, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 16th

of November last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwile, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d Day of this Instant February: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in these Cases where some Berestt and Advantage should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benesit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Desence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September, 1778, and of the 17th of May, 1780, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwise, Gangowportation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gangow-der, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Redrictions mentioned in the faid Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no l'erion or Persons whosoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Pincipal Officers of the Orunance, for His Mijesty's Serviced do at the Union desired the Property of the Pr vice) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of

AT the Court at St. James's, the 15th of February, this instant February, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vesici, in order to tramporting the same beyond the Seas, or corre-ing the same Coastwife, except in the Cries com-prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majetty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forseitures and I enalties institled by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act "to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Extoportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower "His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms "or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appersain.
