And also to grant to the Reverend Thomas Vyner, Master of Arts, the like Place and Dignity of a Canon or Prebendary, void by the Death of the Reverend Doctor Lynford Caryl.

The King has been pleased to grant ento Robert Meggison, of Newcastle upon Tyne, Gentleman, and his Issue, (pursuant to the Wilco his Uncle Michael Pearlon, late of the same Place, Esq. deceased) -His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Pearlon only; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
