E pleased to acquaint the Lords Commisfioners of the Admiralty, that I failed from the Bar of New-York, in the London, the 10th of November, and arrived at Antigua the 6th of December, to put on Shore my Prisoners, having taken on the Passage a French Ship called the Imperieux, of 800 Tons, 38 Guns and 319 Men, from Cadiz for Philadelphia, laden with Salt, some Arms, Cannon, and mixed Goods, besides Medicine. The 9th I sailed from An-

tigua, and arrived at Jamaica the 17th.

Enclosed you will receive a List of the Prizes taken by the Cruizers on the North American Station between the 20th of August and 31st of October, being the most correct Account I have

been able to obtain.
