The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleased, by His Royal Pioclamation, bearing Date the 2cth Day of Oc-ber, 1776, to promite and declare,

That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Sea. man, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who thould, on or before the 31ft of December then follow. ing, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefly's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhould be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the 31st Day of De-cember, 1776: And whereas His Majefty was like-wife pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing whe pleased, by His Royal Froctamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August, 1777, to promife and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter him-felf to ferve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majesty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man to be paid the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Pay-ment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft Day of this instant March; and it being judged texpedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Pay-ment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this inftant March, to the 30th Day of June next, inclu-five.
