PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

HEREAS John Earl of Loudoan was duly elected and returned to be One of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland,

to fit in the House of Peers in the prefent Parliament of Great Britain, and is fince deceased; in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to fit in his Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, firstly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to allemble and meet at Holy Rood House in Edincurgh, on Wednefday the 24th Day of July next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and chufe another Peer of Scotland, to fit and vote in the Houfe of Peers of this p cfint Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of the feid John Earl of Loudoun, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers tact thall then be prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as shall be absent, (fuch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witnefies, and both Conflituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law.) And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the principal Cierks of the Seffion as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby refpec-tively required to attend fuch Meeting, and to adminilter the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes ; and, immediately after fuch Election made and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer fo elected, and fign and attelt the fame in the Prefence of the faid Peers, the Electors, and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We firidly charge and command, That this Proclamation be duly published at the Market Crofs at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns in Scotland Tweath fue Days at least before the Time Scotland, Twenty five Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed on fuch Election.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fifth Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-two, in the Twenty-second Year of Our Reign.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 5th of June, 1782,

PRESENT, The KING's Mode Excellent Majefty in Council. The KING's Mon Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS it has been found neceffary, during the prefent Hofilities with France, Spain and the States General of the United Pro-vinces, by temporary Laws which are now in Force, to fuspend in fome Degree the Regulations preferibed by an Act of Parliament made in the 12th Year of the Reign of King Charles the Second, entitled, An Act for the encouraging and increasing of Ship-ping and Navigation; and to permit divers Goods and Commodities to be imported into this Kingdom, and the Kingdom of Ireland, in Forcign Veffels, although fuch Goods are not flipped and brought direfully from the Place or Country of their Growth, dire fily from the Place or Country of their Growth, Production or Manufacture, or from the Ports or Places from whence fuch Goods are or ufually have been first shipped for Transportation : And whereas it has been represented unto His Majelly, that some of the faid Foreign Veffels, laden with fuch Goods

Ireland, have been feized by fome of His Majefty's Ships, or Private Commissioned Ships, and proceeded against in the Courts of Admiralty; and that fuch of the Goods laden on Board fome of the faid Foreign Veffels, as have appeared to be the Property of His Majesty's Subjects, have been condemned in the faid Courts of Admiralty as lawful Prize, by Reafon of their having been laden in the Territories or Dominions of some of His Majesty's Enemies: --His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby declare, that fuch Goods and Commodities, the Property of His Majefty's Subjects, as shall be laden in Foreign Velfels, and destined to be imported into this Kingdom, or the Kingdom of Ireland, under the Authority and Permission of the aforesaid temporary Laws, fhall, from henceforth, be free and protected from Seizure and Detention by any of His Ships of War, or Private Commiffioned Ships, in the fame Man-ner as Goods, the Property of Subjects of Foreign States in Amity with His Majefty, which are laden on Board the faid Ships. And in Cafe any of the faid Foreign Ships, with their Cargoes, shall here-after be feized and brought into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of Ireland, by any of His Ma-jefty's Ships of War, or other Commiffioned Ships, or Ships or Veffels the Property of any of His Ma-jefty's Subjects, and shall be brought to Adjudication in any Court of Admiralty; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby further order and declare, that fuch of His Majefty's Subjects as are the lawful Owners of any Goods laden on Board any of the faid Foreign Veffels, which shall be so brought in and proceeded against in any Court of Admiralty, shall be at Li-berty to claim them in the faid Court of Admiralty; and the faid Goods shall be decreed to be restored to them, upon Proof made that they are the lawful Owners thereof, notwihitanding that the fame were thipped and laden within the Dominions or Territories of any of the Powers with whom His Majesty is at War.
