The Earl Temple, who embarked Yesterday Evening at Holyhead on Board His Majefty's Yacht the Dorfet, arrived early this Morning in this Harbour. His Lordship was received at landing by the Lord Mayor and Sheriffs of the City of Dublin; the Regiments of Foot in Garrison lined the Streets through which his Lordfhip paffed to the Caftle, attended by a Squadron of Horfe. His Lordfhip was received at the Caffle by Two Privy Councillors, who acquainted his Lordhip, that as his Grace the Lord Lieutenant was unable to come to the Cafile, in confequence of the Accident his Grace had met with lately, his Lordfhip would be received by his Grace at His Majefly's Lodge in the Phoenix Park. About One o'Clock Lord Temple Phoenix Park. About One o Clock Lord Temple proceeded to the Phoenix Park, efcorted by the Squadron of Horfe, the Streets from the Caffle towards the Park being lined by the Infantry. Upon his Lordfhip's Arrival at the Lodge in the Park, he was introduced in Form to the Duke of Portland, who received him fetting in a Chair of Stoke After a thort Conference a Proceeding was State, After a frort Conference, a Proceffion was made to the Chamber in which the Council were affembled, where his Lordship's Commission was read, and the Oaths administered to him; after which, Lord Temple having received the Sword from his Grace the Duke of Portland, the Great Guns in the Park were fired, and answered by the Regiments on Duty. His Excellency then returned to the Caffle, where he received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diffinction upon his fafe Arrival to take upon him the Government of this Kingdom.
