The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS by virtue of an Act paffed in W the Twenty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for preventing certain ** Infiruments from being required from Ships be-** longing to the United States of America, and to "" give to His Majesty, for a limited Time, certain "Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Com-" merce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Do-" minions and the Inhabitants of the faid United " States;" which faid Act was continued, by an Act paffed in the last Session of Parliament, until the 20th of April, 1784, His Majefly was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 26th of December, 1783, to make divers Regulations for carrying on the Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the United States of America. And whereas by another Act paffed in the laft Sellion of Parliament, the Powers granted to His Majetty by the faid first recited Act, are further continued until the land inft recited Act, are forther continued until the zoth Day of June, 1784; His Majefty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that any unmanufactured Goods or Merchandizes, the Im-portation of which into this Kingdom is not prohi-bited by Law, (except Oil) and any Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, heing the Growth or Production of any of the being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of America, may (until further Or-der) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or American Shiph, by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in, and belonging to, the faid, United States, or any of them, and may be entered and landed in any Port in this Kingdom, upon Payment of the same Duties as the like Sort of Goods or Merchandize are or may be fubject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects, in British Ships, from any British Island or Plantation in America, and no other, notwithstanding such Goods or Mer-chandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certifi-

And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be the fame Drawbacks, Exemptions and Bounties on Merchandizes and Goods exported from Great Britain, into the Territories of the faid United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleafed to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner abovemen-tioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom; and, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy (except as hereinafter excepted) fuch Tobacco may be warehoused under His Majesty's Locks, upon the Im-porter's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, within the Time li-mited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Tobacco, at the Time it shall be fo landed, with the fame Allowances for the Payment of fuch farther Duties, and under the like Restrictions and Regulations in all other Respects, not altered by this Order, as fuch Tobacco is and may be warehoused by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parliament in Force; but it is His Majefty's Pleafure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Tobacco into the Ports of London, Briftol, Falmouth, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Whiteha-ven, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all Duty, commonly called the Old Subidy, as of an the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, but with-out any Allowance for prompt Payment of the faid Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, or any other of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money; and that if any Tobacco, which has been or fhall be fo imported, during the Con-tinuance of this Order, from the Territories of the aid United States, into the Gid Parts of London faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Brittol, Falmouth, Portfinouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Whitehaven, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time himited, out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured under His Majeffy's Locks, in Manner herein be-fore directed, at either of the above Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been or shall be entered into for Payment of the faid Duties, shall be discharged in the Manner directed by the feveral Acts of Parliament in Force.
