AT the Court at St. James's, the 16th of April, 1784,

P R E S E N T; The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HIS Day the Right Honorable Lord Vifcount Galway, Comptroller of His Majefty's Houfehold, was, by His Majefty's Command, fworn of His Majefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

P R E S E N .T, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS by virtue of an Act paffed in the Twenty-third Year of His Majefly's Reign, initialed, "An Act for preventing certain "Infiruments from being required from Ships be-"longing to the United States of America, and to " give to His Majefty, for a limited Time, certain " Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Com-" merce between the Subjects of His Majefty's Do-" minions and the Inhabitants of the faid United "States;" which faid Act was continued, by an ..... Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, until the 20th of April, 1784, His Majelty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing. Date the 26th of December, 1783, to make divers Regulations for carrying on the Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of His Majefty's Dominions, and the Inha-bitants of the United States of America. And whereas by another Act paffed in the laft Seffion' of Parliament, the Powers granted to His Majetty by the faid firft recited Act, are further continued until the 20th Day of June, 1784; His Majefty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that any unmanufactured Goods or Merchandizes, the Imunmanufactured Goods or Merchandizes, the Im-portation of which into this Kingdom is not prohi-bited by Law, (except Oil) and any Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of America, may (until further Or-der) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom either in British or American Ports of this Kingdom, either in British, or American Ships, by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in, and belonging to, the faid United States, or any of them, and may be entered and landed in any Port in this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Duties as the like Sort of Goods or Merchandize are or may be fubject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects, in British Ships, from any British Island or Plantation-in America, and no other, notwithstanding fuch Goods or Mer-chandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law:

And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be the fame Drawbacks, Exemptions and Bounties on Merchandizes and Goods exported from Great Britain, into the Territories of the faid United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Pro-duction of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner abovementioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom; and, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty commonly called the Old Sublidy (except as hereinafter excepted) fuch Tobacco may be ware-houfed under His Majefty's Locks, upon the Im-porter's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, within the Time li-mited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of such Tobacco, at the Time it shall be fo landed, with the fame Allowances for the Payment of fuch farther Duties, and under the like Reftrictions and Regulations in all other Respects, not altered by this Order, as such Tobacco is and may be warehoused by virtue of any Act or Acts of Par-liament in Force; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheles, that upon the Importation of any fuch Tobacco into the Ports of London, Briftol, Falmouth, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Whiteha-ven, Greenock, and Port Glasgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, bet without any Allowance for prompt Paymons of the faid Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, or any ether of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money ; and that if any Tobacco, which has been or shall be fo imported, during the Continuance of this Order, from the Territories of the faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Briftol, Falmouth, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Whitehaven, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time limited, out of the Warehoufes wherein the fame shall be fecured under His Majefly's Locks, in Manner herein be-fore directed, at either of the above Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been or shall be entered into for Payment of the faid Duties, shall be discharged in the Manner directed by the feveral Acts of Parliament in Force.

And in order to facilitate the carrying on Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in the Weft Indies, including in that Defcription the Bahama Iflands, and the Bermuda or Somers Iflands, and the People and Territories belonging to the faid United States of America, His Majefty is horeby further pleafed to order, that Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Hemp and Flax, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, Staves, Heading, Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horfes, Theat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provifions; Peas, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Production of any of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported by Britifh Subjects, in Britifh Built Ships owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any Port of the faid United States of America, to any of His Majefty's Weft India Iflands, the Bahama Iflands, and the Bermuda or Somers Iflands; and that Rum, Sugar, Melaffes, Coffee
