And it being their Lordships Intention, THAT THE BENEFIT OF THIS ENLARGED DISCOUNT SHOULD NOT BE CONFINED SOLELY TO THE METROPOLIS, BUT BE EQUALLY EXTENDED TO THE RESPECTIVE DEALERS IN ALL PARTS OF THE KINGDOM; the Commissioners do give further Notice, that the Distributors of Stamps, and their Deputies and Agents, in the different Counties, will be authorized to MAKE THE SAME ALLOWANCE FROM THE TIME BEFORE MENTIONED:

And the Commissioners do hereby also give Notice to the said several Dealers, that it is expected and required that none of these Articles shall be sold, without the proper Stamps being previously PASTED OR AFFIXED thereto, as the Law directs; and that effectual Measures will be taken to detect and prosecute all such Persons as shall, after this Caution, defraud the Public Revenue herein.
