Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Chancellor, and the Marquis of Stafford, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read ccordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for raifing a certain Sum of Money by Way of Annuities, to be charged on the Consolidated Fund, and for making perpetual certain Duties of Excise on British Spirits, and certain Duties on the Amount of assessed Taxes.

An Act for raising a certain Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three.

An Act for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia in that Part of Great Britain called England, for One Year, beginning the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand hundred and ninety-three, and for making Provision for Adjutants who have served a certain Time in the Militia.

An Act for the better Supply of Mariners and Sea-men to serve in His Majesty's Ships of War, and on Board Merchant Ships and other Trading Ships and Vessels, during the present War

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtyfirst Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all Persons. " who have been concerned in advising or carrying-" into Execution a certain Order of Council respecting the Importation of a limited Quantity

payable upon the Importation of Salt Petre, " and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof;" it was, amongst other Things, enacted, that the United Company of Merchants trading to the East Indies should, and they were thereby required, Half-yearly, at each of their Publick Sales, to put up Five Thousand Bags of Salt Petre more than should appear, upon an Average taken of the Four . last preceding Sales, to have been fold by the faid United Company at each of the faid Sales, at the Price of Thirty-one Shillings per Hundred Weight, and not higher, in Time of Peace, and at the . Price of Forty Shillings per Hundred Weight, and not higher, in Time of War or Publick Hostility; and that the Refraction of such Salt Petre so put up . should not exceed on an Average Five Pounds in every One Hundred and Twelve Pounds of fuch Salt Petre; and that in case the said United Company should not, as before directed, declare, within Fourteen Days before each Publick Sale, their Intention to put up, or in case they should not, at each Publick Sale, put up the before mentioned Quantity of fuch Salt Petre, at the before mentioned Prices respectively, it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation from any Foreign Country of the Whole of the faid Quantity of Salt Petre, or of so much thereof, as the Case may be, the Produce or Manufacture of any Country whatever, subject to the Duty of Three Pence for each and every Hundred Weight thereof, as should be sufficient to make the Quantity fo declared and fo put up by the faid United Company, at the Price before directed, amount to the full Quantity of Five Thousand Bags, more than should appear, by an Average taken of the Four last preceding Sales, to have been fold by the faid United Company at each of the faid Sales; and the Importation of such Quantity of Salt Petre, subject to the said Duty of Three Pence for each and every Hundred Weight thereof, should be in fuch Manner, and under fuch Regulations, Refirictions, Securities and Conditions, as His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforesaid, should order.
