At Three o'Clock the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Ma-jefty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City.
