P R Е SENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and contagious Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifefted itfelf at Baltimore in the State of Maryland, has ceased : His Majesty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine, laid by His Majefty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 12th Day of November, 1794, upon all Ships, Vesiels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizc, now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive from Baltimore, or any other Port or Place in the faid State of Maryland, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done, in cafe fuch Order of the 12th Day of November, 1794, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithflanding ; provided that the Mafters or other Perfons, having Charge of fuch Ships or Veffels refpectively, do first make Oath, before the Caltom-Houfe Officer or Chief Magistrate as the Places respectively

rived, or shall arrive, that their Crews are free from all Infaction .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefly's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers

Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the | Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas Hist Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the afaid Month of February, 1793, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for vevery Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June; and it being judged expe-- dient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time "limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant June, to the Thir-• ty-first Day of August next inclusive : Whereof all Perons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

# Diamond, at Anchor off the Islands of St. Marcon, July 5, 1795. SIR,

IN purfuance of the Orders of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, I failed from St. Helen's on the Evening of the 1ft Instant, and stretched across the Channel towards Cherbourg, His Majesty's Ships Syren and Sibylle, also Four Guo-Boats in Company. On looking into that Port we found that One of the Three Frigates which had been feen there the last Time we were off, was missing: The Matter of a Neutral Veifel, just come out, informed me fhe had failed to the Eaftward, and I accordingly proceeded in quaft of her. Going round Cape Bar-fleur, we faw Two Ships, One of them having the Appearance of the Frigate in Question, at Anchor under the Sand, and immediately made Sail towards them; we foon after faw a Convoy coming along Shore, within the Itlands of St. Marcon. The Wind dying away, and the Ebb Tide making against me, I was obliged to Anchor, and had the Mortification to fee the Enemy's Veffels drift with the Tide under the Batteries of La Hogue, without being able to approach the:n.

At Four o'Clock in the Morning of Yesterday, the Breeze fpringing up with the first of the Flood, I made the Signal to the Squadron, weighed, and worked up towards the Enemy's Ships, which we observed warping closer in Shore under the Battery on la Hogue Point. As we approached I made the Signal for each Ship to engage as the came up with the Enemy, and at Nine o'Clock began the Action in the Diamond. The other Frigates having been fent in Chace in different Quarters the Day before, had not been able to anchor fo near in as we did, and were confequently to Leeward, as were Two of the Gun-Boats. The Fearless and Attack were with me, and their Commanders conducted them in a Manner to merit my Approbation, by drawing off the Attention of the Enemy's Gun-Boats, of which they had Two also. The finall Vessels of the Convoy ran into the Pier before the Town. The largest, a Corvette, continued warping into fhoal Water; we followed, engaging her and the Batteries for Three Quarters of an Hour; when finding that the Enemy's Ship had attained a Situation where it was impoffible to get fairly alongfide of her without grounding likewife, and the Pilots being politive as to the Necessity of hauling off from the Shore, where the Water had already begun to cbb, I acquiefced under their Repre-fentations, and wore Ship. The Syren and Sibylie were come up by this Time, and the Zeal and Ability of their Commanders would, I am perfuaded, have carried them into Action with fome Effect, if I had not annulled the Signal to engage, which I did, to prevent them getting difabled, as we were, when we had no longer a Profpect of making ourfelves Masters of the Enemy's Ship. She had fuffered in Proportion, and we now fee her laying on her Broadfide, with her Yards and Top-Mails struck, but, I am forry to her Yards and Top-Maits fituck, but, I am forry to to be joined at Revel by Four Ships, when it would fay, fo much fheltered by the Reef which runs off confit of Four Ships of 74 Guns, Eight of 66, from La Hogue Point, that I cannot indulge a Hope and Eight Frigates, and was thence to proceed with of her being defiroyed. and Ship's Company, I must add, that their Conduct was fuch as gave me Satisfaction: I received the most able Affistance from the First Lieutenant Mr. Pine, and Mr. Wilkie the Matter, in working the Ship, on the Precision of which every Thing depended, circumstanced as we were with respect to the Shoals and the Enemy. The Guns of the Main Deck were well ferved, under the Direction of Lieutenants Pearfon and Sandsbury, and the Men wore cool and collected. No Officer was hurt, but I am forry to fay I have loft One of the belt Quarter-Mafters in the Ship, Thomas Gullen, killed, and Two Seamen wounded. The Enemy fired high, or we should have suffered more materially from their red-hot Shot, the Marks of which were visible in the Rigging. We have shifted our Fore and Main Top-Mails, which, with Two Topfail-Yards, were fhot through, and having repaired our other more trifling Damages, I shall proceed in the Attainment of the Objects of the Cruize. Fishing-Boats, with which we have had an Intercourfe, confirm all former Accounts of Diffreis for Want of Provisions, and the confequent Discontent in this distracted Country.

BEING off Point D'Enqui on the 3d Instant, we faw, near St. Maloes, Thirteen Sail, which we gave Chace to, and, coming up with them, drove the Merchant Vessels, in different Directions, to Leeward, whilft the Veffels of War kept to Windward, and endeavoured to gain the Port of St. Maloes, which they at last effected, except One Brig, which was taken by this Ship, and Six of the most concderable of the Merchant Vessels, which were taken bhiefly by the Hebe, with her usual Activity. It ceing rainy Weather, the others, fmall Vessels, escaped to Leeward. This prove i to be a Convoy which failed in the Morning from St. Maloes, bound to Brehat and Breft, under a Ship of War of 26 Guns, Two Brigs and a Lugger. The Veffels we have taken are faid to have Military Stores on Board. The Brig of War mounts Four Twenty-four-Poun-ders, and had Sixty Men.
