THE Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea-Officers from the 1st of January to the 30th of June, 1795, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf: These are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of the Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, viz.

On Monday the 5th and Tuesday the 6th of October next, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Wednesday the 7th and Thursday the 8th, to Lieutenants and their Attornies:

And on Friday the 9th to Masters and Surgeons.

After which the List will be recalled the First and Third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them; and not only to bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance to His present Majesty: And in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leaves, before the Half-Pay can be paid.

And as by an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy;" it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply by Letter to the Treasurer of the Navy in London to have such Half-Pay paid at or near his Place of Residence in the Manner pointed out by the said Act;" Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 30th of June, 1795, will commence paying on Monday next, the 5th of October; and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
