(who on every Occasion afforded me the most ready Assistance) and Lieutenaut-Colonel Graham, they were

kept off.

Biabou being upwards of Twelve Miles from Kingston, without Provision, and little Ammunition, it appeared by no Means prudent to take Post here; I therefore, as soon as the Men had got some little Rest, and it became dark, (after having ordered Fires to be kindled) resumed our March towards ki goon unmolested.

Permit me, before I conclude, to express the heavy Loss I sustained in the Want of the able Assistance of Brigadier-General Strutt, who was severely wounded soon after the Commencement of the Attack, as well as that of Major Harcourt and other brave Officers specified in the Return of our Loss,

which I have the Honor to fend with this.

I Have to request you will inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that the French Corvette called La Bonne Citoyenne, mounting 20 Nine-Pounders, and carrying 145 Men, was cap

tured Yesterday by the Sq adron under my Orders, Cape Finisterie E. by N. 58 Leagues. She left Rochfort on the 4th Instant, in Company with La Forte, La Seine, La Regenerée Frigates, and La Mutine Brig, destined for the Isle de France, and have Troops and a great Quantity of Soldiers Cloathing on Board for that Place.
