Extract of a Letter from Sir Edward Pellew, Bart. Captain of His Majesty's Ship Indefatigable, to Mr. Nepean, dated off Quiberon, the 9th of April,

N the 20th Ultimo, we chased Three Corvettes, One of which, La Volage of 26 Guns, we drove on Shore under a Battery in the Month of the Loire. and difmasted her, but she was afterwards got off. In this Affair the Amazon had Four Men wounded; the other Two Ships got into the Loire. We have also captured and destroyed the Vessels as per inclosed Lift.
