ISPATCHES, of which the following are Copies, have been received from Colonel Graham by the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

> Head Quarters of Field-Marshal Wurmser's Army, Valeggio, August 1, 1796.

MY Lord,

Have the Honor to inform your Lordflaip, that the Siege of Mantua is raifed, the French having retreated last Night with the utmost Precipitation.

I can now fend only a very hafty Account of the Operations of the Imperial Army, which have been attended with fuch fignal Succefs.-The great Exertions the Enemy were making against Mantua deter-mined his Excellency Field-Marshal Count Wurmfer to make Dispositions for attacking the Enemy, withbut waiting for the Arrival of further Reinforce-ments. Accordingly, on the 28th Ultimo, the different Corps were affembled at their respective Deffinations, the Army forming Four Divisions, which were to advance by the different Passes from the Mountains of the Tyrol. The First Column, on the Right of the Lago de Garda, under the Orders of Lieutenant-General Quafdanowich, was to march on Salo and Brefcia; the Second, commanded by Lieutenant-General Melas, between the Lake and the Adige, was to force all the Enemy's strong Posts on Monte Baldo ; the Third was ordered to march, under the Command of Lieutenant-General Davidowich, by the Great Road from Alla, and, being feparated only by the Adige from a Part of the Third Division, was to support it, and join it as soon as a Bridge could be placed between Dolci and Rivoli; the Fourth Column, under the Command of Lieutenant-General Mezaros, was defigned to turn the

Enemy's Right Flank, by marching from Baffano on Legnago.

Early on the 29th the Enemy was attacked on their whole Line of Posts, and were every where Lieutenant-General Quafdanowich took driven. 1000 Prifoners at Salo, and marched on Brefcia. General Melas attacked the Polt of Ferrara on the Summit of Monte Baldo, covered by an immense Ravine; his Troops crofied it with the greatest In-trepidity, and drove the Enemy from their Retrenehments, Batteries and Redoubts : A Part of his Division attacked, with equal Courage and Succefs, the narrow Pafs of Brentino, between the Mountain and the Adige. The Artillery of the Third Division supported this Attack from the Left Bank of the River ; and the fame Corps, which acted under the Command of Lieutenant-General Sepotendorff, pushed on along the Right Bank, and forced the important Poft of Rivoli, where the Enemy's Batteries commanded the Paffage of the River. In these Attacks Nine Pieces of Cannon and 1500 Men were taken. The other Divisions advanced with little Refittance. On the 30th the Two Center Divisions, being united, continued their March in different Columns on Castel Nuovo and Pelchiera; at the Defiles of Campora and Cavaggione the Enemy were again driven, with Lofs, from ftrong Politions, and in the Night they retreated by Pefchiera.

Major-General Spiegel entered Verona, which the Enemy abandoned. On the 31st Major-General Pittoni occupied Villa Franca, and the Head Quarters were fixed here without Oppofition ; a Corps of Ob-fervation being left near Petchiera, under the Com-mand of Major-General Bajolitz. Thefe well-concerted and rapid Movements determined General Buonaparte to an immediate Retreat across the Po and the Mincio.

### Head Quarters, Goito, August 2, 1796.

My Lond,

SINCE I had the Honor of writing to your Lord-thip Yesterday, the Field-Marthal has received Accounts from General Canto D'Irlas, Commandant of Mantua, which state, that the Enemy, having marked their Retreat by continuing to fire as ufual on the Place during the Night, he could only fend his Cavalry in Purfuit of them Yefterday Morning, and that they had already brought in about 600 Pritoners, among them a great Number of Artillery Men; that he was in Poffession of all their Mortars and Cannon, amounting to about 140, with 190,000 Shells and Balls, and great Quantities of other Stores of all Kinds. The Head Quarters were removed here To-Day, and the Army will continue the Pursuit of the Enemy; but the exceflive Fatigue the Troops thave undergone, the Difficulty of supplying them at first where no Magazines could be previously formed, and the excellive Heat of the Weather, retard the Progrefs of the Army. No further Report is yet received from Lieutenant General Qualdanowich.

P. S. No Reports having been as yet received from the different Divisions, I cannot mention the Lofs of the Imperial Army; but I am happy to be able to state, from general Information, that it is inconfiderable, in Comparison of what might have been expected from the Difficulties that were furmounted.

### Head Quarters, Guidizolo, August 4, 1796.

My Lord. FIELD-Marshal Wurmfer, with a View of affifting the Operations of Lieutenant-General Quafdanowich, having fent General Liptaye with an Ad-

vanced Guard, on the 2d, to Caffiglione delle Ste-viere, marched a Body of Troops early Yetterday Morning from Goito to fupport him.

General Liptaye had been forced to retire from Caftiglione, and was nearly furrounded on the Heights between it and Solforino. The Cavalry difengaged him, and the Regiments forming as they came up, the Affair became general, the Imperial Troops maintaining their Ground, notwithstanding the great Superiority of Numbers of the Enemy, till Night put an End to the Combat. Too much Praife cannot be given to those Regiments which were first engaged, and which fuftained, alone, the Attack of Three Divisions of the French Army, nor to the Cavalry, which repeatedly repulfed the French Ca-valry, confifting of 3000 Horfe. The whole Auitrian Force engaged confifted of about 13,000 Infantry and 1500 Cavalry. All is quiet hitherto To-Day, both Armies remaining opposite to one another in the fame Polition as Yesterday,

### Head Quarters, Valoggio, August 5, 1796.

THE French Army having Yesterday received very confiderable Reinforcements from the Milanois,

Wing of the Imperial Army, which extended into the Plain, the Field-Marshal ordered that it's Front fhould be changed, by being thrown back towards the high Ground on which the Right Wing was posted. During this Movement the Enemy attacked in great Force on the high Ground ; and fome of the Butalions of the Right Wing having given Way, fell in with thole of the Left Wing not yet posted. This unfortunately created Confusion, and obliged the Field-Marshal to retreat on this Place. Lieutenant-General Mezaros, who was on his Way from Borgo-forté to join the Army, arrived To-Day at Goito. There are no Accounts yet of Lieutenant-General Qualdanowich, fo that it is probable he is still among the Mountains, and the Enemy being collected in fuch Force near the South End of the Lago de Garda, it will be very difficult for him now to form a Junction that Way,

Copy of a Letter from Captain John Ignateaff, com-manding Her Imperial Majesty's Sloop Dispatch, to Evan Nepean, Esq; Secretary of the Admiralty, dated Yarmouth Roads, August 22, 1796.

SIR.

I Have the Honor to acquaint you, for their Lord-<sup>1</sup> fhips Information, that, cruizing with Her Im-perial Majefty's Sloop under my Command off the Texel, with the Fleet, on the 20th Instant, at Four o'Clock in the Morning, being about Three Miles to Windward of it, the Admiral made me a Signal to examine a strange Vessel then in Sight, Upon flopping her, I found her to be an English Merchant Brig, named the Nelly, of Sunderland, proceeding to Fluihing, having been captured on the 18th Initant by L'Augustine, French Schooner Privateer. I fent her immediately to the Admiral, and feeing a fufpicious Vessel a-head of me at a great Distance, I lost no Time in giving Chace to her, and in the Course of Five Hours, by the Help of towing and rowing, I came up with her, when, after firing a few Shot, I had the Pleafure to fee her strike her and a ftrong Column, from Bozolo and Marcaria, Colours.
