The KING's Most Excellent Majerty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the 1fl of June laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaflwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Pefre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence. from the faid 7th Day of December next, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this King. dom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Perre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunution, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign,
