Copy of a Letter from Captain John Drew, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Cerberus, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated in Carriand Bay, the 29th of September, 1796.

S I R,

I Beg Leave to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty of my Arrival here, with His Majesty's Ship Cerberus under my Command, having captured La Didon French Cutter Privateer, Nine Days out of Granville, and had taken nothing, carrying Four Brafs Four-Pounders, with Swivels, small Arms and Thirty Men. THE Diamond has sent into this Port L'Amaranthe French National Brig, of Twelve Six-Pounders and Nine Men, from Havre, bound to Brest, which she captured Yesterday off Alderney.
