The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the mation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promise and de-clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majelly's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or

A T the Court at St. James's, the 15th of February, Majety's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time PRESENT, the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Twenty-eighth Day of this instant February; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Twenty-eighth Day of this instant February to the Thirtieth Day of April next inclusive: -- Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade " between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging "to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize the control of the contr rize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of

Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to such Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock be imported into the said Island from any of the Ternitories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from some Port in Great Britain, or some other Port of His Majesty's Do-minions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence thall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar, Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively, granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-feven, shall be of any Force or liffect: And His Majesty is hereby fur-ther pleased to order, That, the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newfound land where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Culloms there, having full invorted on the Eack of such Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of teach Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Foffeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Maller, or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the said Licence, so indorsed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scoland, or to the Commissioners of it is Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted. L Ieutenant Sanders, of the Phoenix, who has Charge of the Difficile Privateer, informs me she was captured by the Phœnix, Triton and Scourge last Sunday Night, at Half past Eleven o'Clock. She mounts Eighteen Guns, had Two Hundred and Six Men on Board, and failed Three Days before from Breft.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Young, Communaer of His Majesty's Ship Greybound, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated at Spithead, February 18, 1797. SIR,

I Request you will inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 18th Instant, at Seven A. M. I fell in with, Five Leagues to the Westward of Beachy-Head, Le Tartane French Privateer Brig, of Sixteen Guns, Four-Pounders, and Sixty Men, from Dieppe, on a Cruize, had taken nothing.

I feel myfelf much obliged to Captain Chefshyre, of His Majesty's Sloop Plover, on seeing the Greyhound in Chace, and his being to Leeward, by hawling athwart, occasioned the Capture of the Privateer much fooner than the otherwise would have been.

Eurydice, in the Downes, February 11, 1707. SIR,

AST Sunday Morning, immediately on receiving the Intelligence you fent me by the Phoenix Cut-ter, relative to the Privateers which have failed from Ostend and Dunkirk, I proceeded, together with the Queen and Narcissus Cutters, to the Northward, in

Hopes of meeting with fome of them.

On Monday Night, at Half past Nine o'Clock, being then a few Leagues to the Southward and Westward of the Galloper, we fell in with and captured, after a Chace of Three Hours and an Half. Le Flibustier, French Lugger Privateer, of Sixty Tons, mounting Fourteen Four and Three Pounders, with Six Swivels, and manned with Sixty-three Men: She had failed the Night before from Dunkirk, and had not taken any Thing; is a very fine, Vessel, fails fast, and was bound to the Northward to cruize for our Baltic Trade.
