T the Court at Weymouth, the 28th of September, 1798,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Ma-jefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to oblige Ships " more effectually to perform their Quarantine, and " for the better preventing the Plague being " brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain " or Ireland, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Al-" derney, Sark, or Man," it is, among many other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Veffels ar-riving, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain, or any of the Ifles be-fore mentioned, from any Place from whence His more effectually to perform their Quarantine, and fore mentioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, fhall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in such Place and Places, for such Time and in such Manner as has been, or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veisels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchan-dizes shall have respectively performed, and be difcharged from fuch Quarantine, no fuch Perfons, Goods, or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship or Veffel, in any Place within His Majefty's Dominions, junlefs in fuch Manner, and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence as shall be di-rected or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Coun-cil, as aforefaid ; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats, and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, fhall be fubject to fush Orders. Pulse, and Directions correction to fuch Orders, Rules, and Directions, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, and Successfors, in Council, and notified by Procla- Bridgewater, or any of them, or any Member or

mation, or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

And whereas Information has been received, that a malignant and infectious Difeafe, of the Nature of the Plague, exifts in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennfylvania, within the United States of America; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, judging it probable that the faid Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from Philadelphia, doth thereupon deem it expe-dient, for the Safety of the Publick Health, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennfylvania, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Veffel shall come to anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places hereinafter named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places wherein fuch Ships or Veffels (not having the Infection on board) fhall refpectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay, all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, shall perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek; all Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Ipswich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Bofton, Hull, Newcaftle, or Berwick-upon-Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place there-in, fhall perform their Quarantine in White-booth Road, between Hull and Grimfby; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Carlisle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, hall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weft End thereof; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol,

or to Ilfracombe, or Burnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place, within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucefter, Briftol, or Bridgewater, or within the laid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porshute-Pill; all Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been hereinbefore mentioned, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch-Parts thereof as have been hereinbefore mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter, and Pool, except as hereinbefore excepted, or to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or. Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Motherbank, near Portfmouth; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstonels, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anftruther, Prefton-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Weftern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Camp-beltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort-William, Air, Port-Patrick, Strauraer, and Wigtoun, or to any Memher, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlash, in the Island of Arran; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernels, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnels, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Greek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the South-Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Carlthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Isle of Jersey, or any Part thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Island, called Belle-Croute, or at fome Place hereinbefore appointed for Perform-ance of Quarantine on the Coaff of England; and all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Islands of Guernley, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place liereinbefore appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaff of England.

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That no Pilot shall go on board any Ship or Vessel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Vessel;

Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padflow or-St. Ives, being Members of the. Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe, or Burnftaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place, within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucefter, Briftol, or Bridgewater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, fhall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porfhute-Pill; all Ships or Veffels which are full be heaved to the Dart of Plymouth, and Gods, Wares, and Merchandizes, liable.

That all Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, fhall be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order in Council to direct otherwife, and fo remain a Weck, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk, raw, thrown, or wrought, Linen, Cotton Wool, Cotton, Yara, or manufactured; Wool, raw, or anywife wrought, Feathers, Grogram or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goat's Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Sponges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats, and Brufhes, Matting and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes fo as aforefaid enumerated; are to be opened, unpackeft, and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order, in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain for the Space of; a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Vef-. fels respectively shall be aired in the following Places; that is to fay, all such Goods as shall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River. Thames, or Medway, shall be aired in Standgate Creek; all fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Bofton, Hull; Newcaftle, or Berwick upon-Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall be aired in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimfby ; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Ifle of Man, shall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near. Liverpool, at the West End thereof; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgewater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padiltow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Briftol, or Bridgewater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall be aired in Kingroad and Porthute-Pill; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been hereinbefore mentioned, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been hereinbefore mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter, and Pool, except as before excepted, or to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any, Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, fhall be aired in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chichester, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or

of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, (Ihall be aired at a Place called the Motherbank, near Portfmouth; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstoness, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preston-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrole, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay; all fuch Goods as shall be import-ed to the Western Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltown, Oban, Rothfay, Fort-William, Air, Campbeltown, Oban, Rothfay, Fort-William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, fhall be aired at Lamlash in the Island of Arran; all such Goods as shall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernels, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnels, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth; all uch Goods as shall be imported to the South-West Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Greek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Carfthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith; all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jerfey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coaft of the faid Island, called Belle Croute, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships in which fuch Goods are imported stall re-Incclude perform their Quarantine; and all fuch Goods as thall be imported to the Iflands of Guern ley, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, thall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fuch Place hereinbefore appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships in which fuch Goods are imported shall respectively perform their Qua-

Tantine. That whatfoever Ship or Perfon fhall receive any Men or Goods from on board any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Veffel for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection, from the Goods and Merchandizes be-fore enumerated, fhall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majefty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Veffel coming to any of the Ports of Great Bri-tain, or of the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen, or Paffengers from on board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commiffioners and other Officers of His Majesty's Customs do use their utmost Diligence and Care that the Quarantine before directed be

duly performed. That the Commanders of His Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coaffs, and all Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief. Magistrates, Constables, Head-

boroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Minifters of Juffice, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places ap-pointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Peformance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the faid refpective Isles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may re-W. Fawkener. fpectively appertain.

I Acquaint you, for their Lordships' Information, that His Majesty's Ship Triton joined me Yef-terday Afternoon, when I received a Letter of the Ift Inftant from the Honorable Captain Stopford, Commander of the Phaeton, of which the following is an Extract.

Estratt of a Letter from the Honorable Robert Stopford, Captain of His Majefty's Ship Phaeton, to the Right Honorable Admiral Lord Bridport, dated at Sea, the 1st October, 1798.

I Transmit to your Lordship a Letter which I have this Day received from Captain Gore, in-forming me of his having, on the 28th Ultimo, cap-tured a French Schooner Privateer.

SIR, Triton, at Sea, 1st October, 1798. Have the Satisfaction to inform you, that on the 28th of September laft, in a heavy Gale of Wind; His Majefty's Ship under my Command fell in with and captured L'Araignée French Schooner Pri-vateer, mounting Four Four-Pounders and One Nine-Pounder Carronade, but pierced for Ten Guns, carrying Thirty-eight Men; she had been Four Days from Cape Machichaco, with an Intention to cruife Three Months in the Gulph of St. Lawrence; fhe is coppered, built at Liverpool, and appears to fail well.

Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Harvey, Com-mander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Leeward Iflands, to Evan Nepean, Ejq; dated at Fort-Royal Bay, Martinique, August 8, 1798.

SIR, Am to acquaint you, for the Information of their Lordships, that His Majesty's Armed Sloop Charlotte, commanded by Lieutenant John Williams, captured the oth Ultimo, off Demerary, River de Efte Ondenenung Dutch Privateer Schooner, belonging to Surinam, of Eight Guns and Thirty-eight Men, which he fent to Demerary; fhe was upon a Three Months Cruife, had been out Nineteen Days, but made no Captures.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir Hyde Parker, Knt. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessel at Jamaica, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated in Port Royal Harbour, the 27th July, 1798.

SIR,

Aving received a Letter from Captain Lane, of the Acasta, giving an Account of the Proceedings and Success of that Ship, and the Ceres, Captain Otway; and having alfo received a Letter from Captain Eyrc, of His Majefty's Ship Regulus, acquaining me with the Capture of the Veffels thereinmentioned, (Copies of which you will receive herewith,) I am to defire you will be pleafed to lay the fame before the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty for their Information.

Acasta at Sea, Zacheo S. W. distant SIR, Seven Leagues, 13th July, 1798. Have the Pleasure to inform you, that lince my Letter of the 9th May, the Acasta and Ceres have taken, burnt, and deftroyed, the following Veffels; viz.

By the Acasta.

May 1, The St. Mary, of Four Guns, and Twenty-eight Men ; pierced for Four Guns.

May 12, St. Antonio; pierced for Fourteen Guns.

May 20, La Vengeance, Six Guns, Seventy-one

Men; pierced for Ten Guns. June 30, La Trump, Two Guns, Ten Men; pierced for Ten Guns.

July 2, St. Josef de Victorio, Eight Guns, Fifty Men; pierced for Sixteen Guns. Burnt.

July 13, St. Michael Acandoa, Six Guns, Twentyeight Men; pierced for Six Guns.

By the Ceres.

May 12, Sally, Seven Men.

May 18, Goulette, Eleven Men.

May 30, L'Avanture, Fourteen Men. June 1, La Mutinie, Eighteen Guns, One Hundred and Fifty Men; pierced for Eighteen Guns. · Burnt.

June 8, Cargo, Two Guns, Five Men; pierced for Four Guns.

June 20, Two fmall Schooners. Scuttled. June 20, Two fmall Sloops. Scuttled.

The Ceres chafed on the rft June La Mutinie French Privateer Brig, of Eighteen Guns and One Hundred and Fifty Men, to Windward of St. Juan; but, from the State of the Weather and Shoal-Water, was unable, for fome Days, to take Poffeffion of her ; the Crew, in the Interim, had warped her close in Shore for the Purpole of defending her from the Beach; Captain Otway however feat his Boats the

first Moment the Weather permitted, (covering them with the Ceres,) under the Command of Lieutenant Wooldridge. The Enemy having fet Fire to her, quitted, and formed in great Numbers on the Beach, keeping up a very heavy Fire on the Boats; while taking Poffeffion of her, and ftriking the Colours, fome of the Ceres' Shot having taken Place below her Water Line, she filled, which making it im-practicable to bring her off. the Fire was permitted to take Effect. The St. Josef de Victoriofo, of Eight Guns (but pierced for 16) and 50 Men, from Eu-rope, was chaled on Shore by the Acasta, Six Leagues to Windward of St. Juan ; the Boats of which Ship being fent to take Poffeffion, and finding it impoffible to bring her off, fet Fire to and completely deftroyed her. The Ceres chafed to Windward on the Morning of the 6th of May a Sail to the Eaftward into the Mona Paffage. Intelligence was received, upon which was placed great Dependence, that the French Privateers were doing incredible Milchief off the N.E. End of Porto Rico, and of Two Spanish Frigates being daily expected at St. Juan ; we immediately pro-ceeded thither, and made all the above Captures off that Port, but both Ships being extremely short of Provisions and Water, the Ceres not having more than Two Days of all Species on board, I thought it most advisable, under the existing Circumstances, to recruit at St. Thomas's; to which Island we made the beft of our Way, and returned in Four Days from the Time we left our former Station to it again. I am forry to add that the Day previous to our Arrival at St. Thomas's, one of the Enemy's Frigates (the Venus) got into St. Juan, the other we are anxioully looking for, and you may rely upon our remaining out until the last Moment, in Hopes of falling in with her; having this Inftant captured a Polacre Ship from St. Juan, bound to Vera Cruz, under Creek Colours, affords me the Opportunity of fending this Letter, which ought to have gone by the last Prize, but by fome Accident was left behind.

Lieutenant Denman will be able to give you every Information respecting both Ships you may wish for. The Ceres is now in Chace, and has made the Signal for an Enemy which we take to be a Privateer Brig.

Regulas, Cape Nichola Mole, July 17, 1798.

July 17, 1798. I Have the Honor to inform you, that on the 11th Inftant, having difcovered Five Veffels at An-chor in Aguada Bay, at the North-Weft End of the Ifland of Porto Rico, I manned La Pouline, a French Schooner, of Four Guns, and Thirty-two Men, which I had captured a few Days before, and fant her, together with the Boats of the Paculus fent her, together with the Boats of the Regulus, under the Command of Lieutenant Good, to endeavour to cut them out, proceeding in with the Ship for their Protection and Support; the Wind unfortunately failing, neither the Regulus or Schooner could get in near enough to be of any material Service, the whole Effort confequently fell upon the Boats; and it is with great Satisfaction I have to add, that through the judicious Arrangement and very fpirited Conduct of Lieutenant Good, well fupported by Lieutenant Holman and the junior Officers and Men under their Command, Three of the largeft Veffels, confifting of a Ship, a Brig, and an Armed Schooner, were brought away, and had there been the fmalleft Breath of Wind, the fame would have been the Cafe with the other Two, both which were alfo boarded, and in our Poffeffion for a confiderable Time, but it falling a dead Calm at the Moment the Cables were cut, and not having Boats fufficient to tow fo many Veffels, it became neceffary to quit fome, in order to fecure those which appeared of the most Importance.

I have great Pleafure in reprefenting to you the very good Conduct and determined Bravery which was confpicuoufly flown by every Officer and Man in the boarding and towing out these Veffels under a very heavy and inceffant Fire from the Batteries, close to which they had previously been brought as a Security from such an Attempt.

I am forry in concluding, to be obliged to acquaint you with the Lofs which we have fuftained in Mr. Thomas Finch, Mafter's Mate, a very promifing young Man, who was killed by a Grape Shot from one of the Batterics, and was the only Perfon hurt upon this Occafion.

BY Letters from Switzerland, of the 18th September, it appears, that on the 8th and 9th of that Month the Troops of the Canton of Underwalden were, after a most obstinate Resultance, totally defeated by the French Army.

The moft horrid Carnage enfued. Stanz, the principal Town of the Canton, has been reduced to Afhes, and old Men, Women, and Children, put to the Sword without Merey. The French had to contend with Sixteen Hundred of the Inhabitants of Underwalden, who were joined by a few Hundred Volunteers from the neighbouring Cantons. A fmall Body of Peafants from Schweitz performed Prodigies of Valour, and was the Means of faving the Colours of the Canton. The wretched Remains of this unfortunate Army have taken Refuge in the Mountains.
