A T the Court at St. James's, the 31% of Odober, 1798,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the Second of May laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the Seventh Day of November next; and whereas it is judged expedient, that the faid Prohi-bition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perlon or Perlons wholoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Seventh Day of November next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permisfion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtyfourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An "Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been "concerned in advising or carrying into Execution " an Order of the Lords Commiffioners of His Ma-" jefty's Treafury refpecting the Exportation of Pot-"Afhes or Pearl-Afhes; for preventing Suits in "confequence of the fame; for authorizing His " Majefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coaftwile of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for " making further Provisions relative thereto ;" but it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of the faid Ar-

ticles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East-Indies; the Exporters of the faid Articles do firit make Oath of the true Deftination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards. before the Entry of the same shall be made; and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Sa-tisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond (hall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Of-fice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may re-fpectively appertain.

Extract of a Letter from Captain George Countefs, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Ethalion, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated in Plymouth Sound, November 8, 1798.

Have to request you will be pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that fince my Letter of 22d September by Captain White, of the Sylph, I continued to watch the Motions of the French Squadron in His Ma-Motions of the French Squadron in fils Ma-jefty's Ship under my Command, (having with me the Anfon and Amelia,) until the 4th October at Noon, when a hard Gale of Wind coming on, we loft Sight of them in Lat. 53 Deg. 13 Min. North, and Long. 16 Deg. 15 Min. Weft, Sligo-Bay bearing North 77 Eaft, Diftance 91 Leagues. The Wind being off Shore we carried Sail to get in with the Land to give the necellary Inform-ation. The Amelia feparated on the Night of the 9th the Anervioufly defired, in cafe of Sepaation. The Amelia feparated on the Night of the 8th. I had previoufly defined, in cafe of Separation, each Ship to make the best of her Way to give the Alarm. On the 11th we fell in with the Squadron under Sir John B. Warren, but it blowing ftrong, could not get on board to communicate any Intelligence; but feeing the Amelia with him, I was fatisfied he had all the Information I could give. Soon after our joining the above Squadron, the Anfon made the Signal for the Enemy, whom we difcovered coming down, but they hauld to the Wind on obferving us. We chafed and kept clofe to them during the Night, and next Morning the Attack commenced, which no Doubt you have been fully informed of by Sir John Borlafe Warren. After the Hoche ftruck, we purfued the Weathermost Frigate, who was making off, and failed very After a confiderable Chace we came up with faft. and engaged her; fhe made an obflinate Refiftance for an Hour and Fifty Minutes, after we got a-breaft of her, when the ftruck her Colours, most of her Sails having come down, and Five Feet Water in her Hold. She proved to be the Bellone, of Thirty-fix Guns, Twelve Pounders, having Three Hundred Soldiers on board befides her Crew. The Squadron chafed to Leeward, and of courfe we feparated, being obliged to remain by the Prize, and have been under the Necessity of keeping the Sea ever fince.

I eannot fpeak too highly of the Bravery and Conduct of all my Officers during the Action, as well as of their extreme Vigilance in watching them for Seventeen Days. Mr. Sayer, First Lieutenant, is in the Prize, and I can with Pleasure fay, His Majefty has not a more zealous or a better Officer. We had One Man killed and Three wounded : The Enemy appear to have had Twenty killed.

London, November 10, 1798.

On Thursday last Sir Richard Carr Glynn, Knte Lord Mayor Elect for the Year enfuing, was fworn at Guildhall; when the Chair and other Enfigns of Mayoralty were furrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.

Yesterday the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder, and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-fide, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the feveral Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Streamers and Pendants, to Weffminfter ; and having walked round the Hall, and folemnly faluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer Bar, and the new Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black Friars, and from thence in Coaches, with the ufual Solemnity, to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided; at which were prefent feveral of the Foreign Minifters, the Great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of His Majefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council, the Judges, and many other Perfons of Quality and Diftinction.
