Copy of a Letter from Admiral Lord Bridport, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majelty's Ships and Veffels employed in the Channel, to Evan Nepean, Ejq; dated Bath, January 18, 1799. SIR,

E Nclofed is a Copy of a Letter from Captain Cunningham, of His Majefty's Ship Clyde, which I transmit to you for their Lordships' Information.

Clyde, Cawfand-Bay,

My Lord, Jan. 15, 1799. Have the Honor to inform you, that on the 10th 1 Inftant, His Majefty's Ship Clyde, under my Command, captured L'Air Schooner Letter of Marque, from Breft to Saint Domingo; and on the 13th, a Brig Privateer, called Le Bon Ordre, car-rying Sixteen Guns and Sixty-five Men. She failed from Granville on the 20th December, and had captured One Brig from Newfoundland on the 6th Instant.

WE, your Majefty's most faithful Subjects, Members of the Kettering Volunteer Affo-ciation, firmly convinced that the Possefilion of Liberty, of Property,—in a Word, of whatever is dear to us as Britons and as Men, depends upon the Iffue of the Contest in which we are now en-gaged, beg Leave most humbly thus to approach your Majesty, and, with Sentiments of unfeigned Attachment to your Majelty's Perfon and Govern-ment, to offer our heartfelt Congratulations on the late numerous, fignal, and most important Victories which have attended your Majefty's Arms in dif-ferent Quarters of the Globe. We particularly congratulate your Majefty on the Deliverance of our Sifter Kingdom from the repeated Attacks of a desperate and indefatigable Enemy; and from the ftill more dreadful Domestic Commotions into which it had been led by the foul Confpiracy of wicked and turbulent Men : nor can we help expreffing our confident Hopes, that the fame All-ruling Providence, which has fo long and fo eminently diffinguished us among the Nations of the Earth, will

by giving Efficacy to the firm yet leuient Meafures which your Majefty humanely enjoins, not only recall our deluded Fellow-Subjects in Ireland to a due Senfe of the incalculable Mifery they have thus efcaped, but in the End, by uniting us like one People in the Bands of mutual Interest and Affection, augment that Profperity, Concord, and Strength, which render this Island the Admiration of the World, and the general Afylum of expatriated Virtue. Had we not before been fenfible to the Excellence of the Conflitution under which we live, the Example of France would have taught us fully to appreciate its Value. We there behold a People, from being unufed to the Enjoyment of rational Freedom, commence their Political Reform, by burfting afunder every Tie of focial Order, over-turning the whole Fabric of Legitimate Authority, and at last, upon the Ruins of Religion and of Civil Government, erecting a Syftem of Anarchy, Profeription, and Murder at Home, that can be equalled only by the unprincipled Ambition and favage Tyranny which they now difplay Abroad, in their Treatment of those Nations, amongst whom, either by open Force or infidious Professions, they have unhappily gained a Footing. To the un-paralleled Exertions of British Valour, directed by the Wisdom and Vigilance of your Majesty's Councils, we owe our Security hitherto; and we truft, that by fleadily perfevering in the firm and vigorous Meafures neceflary for Self-Defence, not only the British Empire, but the Nations of Europe in general, will be preferved from the inevitable Ruin that must otherwise have overwhelmed them. Though we deeply lament the Calamities of War, and ardently with for a Return of the Bleffings of Peace, we fould be unworthy of the National Advantages we enjoy, as well as of the Confidence reposed in us by your Majesty, did we not declare our firm Determination to defend to the utmost your Majesty's Crown and Dignity, and to maintain unimpaired that happy Conflictution which the Wildom of fucceffive Ages was employed to frame, and which long Experience has the to be equally congenial with the Principles of Rational Liberty and the established Sentiments of Englishmen.

That your Majefly may long continue, in the Enjoyment of every Bleffing, to reign over a free and happy People, is the ardent Prayer of your Majefly's most faithful Subjects.

W Hereas it has been humbly reprefented to His Ma-jefty, That on Wednefday the 26th Day of De-cember laft, between Ten and Eleven o'Clock at Night, cember last, between I en and Eleven of Clock at Night, Mr. Ambrofe Bowden, Sitter of the Custom-House Boat flationed at Cawfand, within the Port of Ply-month, in the County of Devon, being out upon Duty with Four of his Men in his Boat, rowing from Caw-fand Beach towards Penlee Point on the Coaft of Cornwall, in confequence of Information which he had re-served, that a Smuggling Veffel called the Lottery was about to land her Cargo near the faid Point, he difco-wered a large Sloop or Cutter lying at Anchor, about Half a Mile from the Point, bearing S. W. by W. That on coming near to the faid Sloop or Cutter, Mr. Bowden perceived feveral Boats lying alongfile of

her and at her Stern; and when he got within about One Hundred Yards of the faid Sloop or Cutter, fome Perfon on board called out and afked, What Boat that was? Upon which Mr. Bowden answered it was a King's Boat; upon which fome Perfon on board the Smuggling Sloop or Cutter, called out and faid, "Keep off, or I will fire into you." Mr. Bowden again faid, that his was a King's Boat, and a Revenue Boat, and dared the People on board to fire. That being by this dared the People on board to fire. That being by this Time within Twenty Yards of the Snuggling Sloop or Cutter, the People on board again ordered Mr. Bow-den to keep off, and fired with Guns or Blunderbuffes at his Boat Three Times, by which Humphry Glinn One of Mr. Bowden's Men in the faid Boat, was killed :- That Mr. Bowden then took up a Musket, which he had in his Boat, and fired at the faid Sloop or Cutter feweral Times, upon which the People on board either cut or flipped their Cable, and failed away before the Wind to the Westward, at the fame Time before the Wind to the Weltward, at the fame Time continuing to fire over her Stern at Mr. Bowden's Boat: That Mr. Bowden, not being able to purfue the faid Sloop or Cutter, returned to Cawfand Bay, where he swent on board of His Majefty's Ship Stag, and the Surgeon and his Mate examined the faid Humphry Glinn, when they found that the fore Part of his Skull was bot arwo, and that the gave guite dead

fot away, and that he was quite dead. His Majefly, for the better difcovering and bringing to Juffice the Perfons concerned in this Felony and Murder, is hereby pleafed to promife His most gra-cious Pardon to any One or more of the faid Offenders (except the Master or Commander of the faid Sloop or Cutter, and the Perfon or Perfons who actually fired) who fhall difcover his or their Accomplices, fo that any One or more of them may be apprehended.
