Copy of a Letter from Captain Horton, of His Majesty's Sloop Fairy, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated at Sea, January 11, 1799.

SIR,

I Have the Satisfaction to advise you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that at Half past Six A. M. I gave chase to a Brig in the S. W. and at Half past Eleven came up with and captured her: She proves to be the Nuestra Señora del Pont St. Buonaventa, mounting Six Carriage Guns, Two Carronades, and carrying Fifty-Five Men, Fifteen of whom, it appears, are on board Two Prizes she had taken from Newfoundland, which, from the Information I have obtained, I am in Hopes of retaking.

I have further to advise you, for their Lordships' Information, that I this Day retook the John M'Donald, from Newfoundland to Lisbon, with Fish, having been captured on the 6th Instant by the Volario Privateer, out of Vigo. I have sent the John M'Donald for Lisbon; but for the present I detain the Buonaventa, as it blows too fresh at present to make the necessary Arrangements.
