Whitehall, November 2, 1799. W Hereas it has been humbly reprefented to His Ma-jefty, that on the 24th of July last, a Smuggling Lugger being observed by fome Officers of the Revenue, In Cricketh or Kickith Bay, in the County of Carnarvon, then landing ber Goods; Richard Bridgewater, Super-vifor of Excife, Maurice Williams, Tide Surveyor of the Cuffons at Pullbely, in the fuid County, together with Two Tide Waiters and fome other Officers in the Service of the Cufloms, went in a Boat in Purfuit of her : that when they came within about Three or Four Hundred Yards of the faid Smuggling Veffel, (the Cultom-Houfe Colours being then flying in the Boat, the Officers hailed her, upon which the Smugglers afked what Boat it was, and upon being told the King's Boat, they ordered the Officers to keep off or abide by the Con-fequence; but being told by the Officers that they floudd not, the Smugglers immediately fired a Mufket, the Ball from which came very near the King's Boat; the Smug-glers then fired Eight other Mufkets, One of which puffed between the Fore and Main-Maft of the King's Boats and another close behind the Officer, Richard Bridgcoater, and upon the Sungglers ibreatening to drive the Officers into the Water if they did not keep off, they returned without being able to board the faid Smuggling

Veffel. The faid Veffel is about Thirty-three Tons Burthens The faid Veffel is about Thirty-three Tons Burthens Black Sides, and without a Name, and had about Eight or Twelve Hands on board, low Stern, wery narrow Waift Gunnell, and fuppofed to have been built at Dover, or in that Part of the Goaff.

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
