IS Majesty has been pleased to grant the Dignity of a Marquis of this Kingdom to Richard Earl of Mornington, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, and the Heirs Male of His Body lawfully begotten, by the Name, Style, and Title of Marquis Wellesley, of Norragh, in this Kingdom. Letters Patent are preparing to pass the Great Seal of Ireland accordingly.

Whitehall, December 13, 1799. The King has been pleased to grant to the Most Honorable Richard Marquis Wellesley, of Norragh, in the Kingdom of Ireland, and Baron Wellesley in this Kingdom, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, in confideration of his great and eminent public Services in the arduous Situation of Governor-General of the British Possessions in the East Indies, from the Time of his taking upon him the faid Government to the glorious Termination of the War with the late Sultan of Mysore, his Royal Licence and Authority to bear, as an ho-norable Augmentation to his Coat of Arms, an Inefcutcheon Purpure charged with an Estoile radiated Wavy between Eight Spots of the Royal Tiger in Pairs faltierwise proper, representing the Standard of the said Sultan, taken at Seringapatam, and presented to the said Richard Marquis Wellesley, at Madras, on His Majesty's Birth-Day, the 4th of June 1709; and also that a Repre-fentation of the said Standard, and of the Tri-coloured Flags taken and presented at the same Time, be added to the Supporters and Crest of the said Richard Marquis Wellesley; the same being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and re-corded in the Heralds' Office: and also to order, that His Majesty's said Concession and especial Mark of his Royal Favor be registered in the College of

HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint his Grace Archibald Duke of Hamilton and

Brandon to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Lanark, in North Britain, his Grace this Day took and subscribed the Oaths of Allegiance and Abjuration, and also subscribed the Assurance, conformably to what is required by an Act passed in the First Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the First.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 11th of December 1799,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fixth Day of June last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant December, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy
